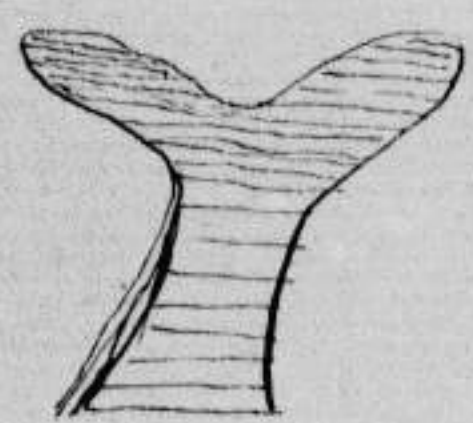


Friday 21st Light breeze from W. N. W.

but saw nothing of the whale.
Hove to on starboard tack.

S. W. Employ'd in mending sail.
At 6 P. M. Goat Island bore N. E. 20
miles. Curtis Rocks bore N. 5 miles.

Sunday 23^d Nearly calm all this day.
At night hove to. Goat Island
bearing N. N. W. 10 miles.

Monday 24th Strong breeze from N. N. W.
Hoisted on board a large cedar
log. Hands employ'd in ship
duty. Hove to heading N. E.

Tuesday 25th Light breeze from N. W.
At 12 M. Goat Island bore W.

Latt. 30, 18
Long. 178, 52

Wednesday 26th Light breeze from W. N. W.
Passed Sunday Island at 10
A. M. Hands employ'd in ship
duty.

Latt. 29, 11
Long. 177, 40

Thursday 27th November, 1851. These
24 hours passed with varia-
ble winds. Latter part rainy.
Steering N. N. E. in sea watches.
Employ'd in various jobs of ship
duty. No observation.

Latt. by Act. 28, 00
Long. 176, 47.

Friday 28th Light winds from S. E. spoke
and jammed with ship C. W.
Morgan of New Bedford, 30
months out, 750 lbs. At night
hove to.

Latt. 27, 26
Long. 175, 45.

Saturday 29th Light variable breeze.
Employ'd in mending sail
and making rope. In morning
saw the Morgan standing to the
westward. At sunset hove
ship and steered S. W.

Latt. 26, 52
Long. 175, 30

Sunday 30th Light breeze from S. Dur-
ing the day steering to W. Saw no
whale. Hove to heading W. S. W.

Latt. 26, 32
Long. 176, 00

Monday, December 1st Light breeze
from S. E. Steering on
the wind starboard tack.
Employ'd in making rope.
Mending sail, &c. &c. Hove to.

Latt. 26, 41
Long. 175, 33
