

Sunday - 18th 1852

Came with a moderate ESE breeze steering NW by N middle part much the same as the first latter part winds increasing at noon a strong breeze near ship & steering SW fine weather so passed these 24 ours

Lat 13 North

Monday - 19th 1852

Came with a strong breeze and fine weather steering SW middle part & latter part much the same as the first men employed variously so ends these 24 ours

Lat - 1° 33 South

Long - 167° 39 West

Tuesday - 20th 1852

Came with a strong ESE breeze steering SW middle part less wind with fine weather steering SW by S the last part of these 24 ours light breeze men employed

Lat - 2° 54 South

Long - 170° 36 West

Wednesday - 21st 1852

Came with light wind from the ENE at 4 o'clock held to the wind heading SE at 6 bout ship & stood NW by W middle part light wind at 10 held the main top sail & back at 6 o'clock hoisted full the main top sail saw the land on the lee quarter kept steering SW by S men employed so ends these 24 ours

Lat - 4° 22 South

Long - 171° 02.30 West

Thursday - 22nd 1852

Came with light wind from the ENE heading SE fine weather middle part a moderate breeze at 6 AM latter part bout ship heading NW men employed so ends these 24 ours

Lat - 4° 30 South

Long 171° 18 West

Friday - 23rd 1852

Came with a moderate breeze from the NE heading NW at 6 PM saw the land on the lee quarter perched the main top galant sail & held up the mainsail middle part backed the main top sail latter part light winds heading NW by N so ends

Lat 3° 05 South

Long 172° 30.30 West

Saturday - 24th 1852

Came with light winds from the SE heading NW by N middle part light wind ship lying aback in the morning hoisted full latter part a strong breeze from the ENE heading N men employed so ends these 24

Lat - 1° 46 South

Long 172° 56.45 West

Sunday - 25th 1852

Came with strong breezes from the ENE heading N middle part wind became light latter part much the same steering NW saw black fish so ends these 24 ours

Lat 00° 19 South

Long - 174° 04.15 West

Monday - 26th 1852

Came with light wind from ENE steering NW fine weather saw & spent on the lee bow but proved to be a fishback all the middle part light wind latter part much the same at 3 o'clock saw sperm whales 2 boats lowered but returned without luck so ends with light wind men employed mending sails



Lat - 00° 16 South

Long - 176° 10 West

Tuesday - 27th 1852

Came with light breeze ENE steering NW by S at 2 o'clock saw Pheby Island at 3 o'clock held to the wind heading SE by S middle part & latter much the same as the first bout ship heading NW men employed mending sails so ends these 24 ours

Lat - 00° 16 North

Long - 176° 24 West

Wednesday - 28th 1852

Came with light winds from E heading NW saw an Island bear NW distance 20 miles from Pheby Island at 4 o'clock saw whales going quick to windward middle part strong breeze bout ship at 3 o'clock heading S latter part much the same saw the land on the weather bow men employed mending sails so ends these 24 ours
