

Thursday - 29th 1852

Corn with a moderate breeze from the E heading SE at 2 o'clock
Set the flying jib & maintopgallant sail middle part. A
moderate breeze latter part a light breeze men employed
So ends these 24 ours -

Lat. 1° 06' South
Long. 176° 35' West

Friday - 30th 1852

Corn with light wind from the E heading SE with fine
weather middle part light wind latter part much the same
men employed at 10 o'clock Saw Whales boats lowered but
returned without success So ends these 24 ours

Lat. 2° 42' South
Long. 176° 45' West

Saturday - 31st 1852

Corn with light wind from the E heading SE middle
& latter part much the same as the first at 12 o'clock middle
part boat ship & stood N men employed mending sails
So ends these 24 ours

Lat. 3° 00' South
Long. 176° 54' 45" West

Sunday - February - 1st 1852

Corn with light ESE wind heading N fine weather at 6 o'clock
boat ship heading SE middle part much the same at 3 o'clock
boat ship heading N by E latter part much the same as first
So ends these 24 ours

Lat. 3° 00' South
Long. 176° 55' West

Monday - February - 2nd 1852

Corn with light wind from the NE heading N by E at 6
shortened sail & backed the maintop sail middle part
no alteration at 6 o'clock latter part kept off steering SW
with a moderate breeze So ends these 24 ours

Lat. 2° 39' South
Long. 178° 38' West

Tuesday February - 3rd 1852

Corn with light wind from the ESE steering WNW
middle part a moderate breeze latter part light breeze
at 12 o'clock held to the wind heading N by E men employed

Lat. 3° 42' South
Long. 180° 21' West

Wednesday February - 4th 1852

Corn with light winds from the NE heading N by E at 6
Saw a sail on the lee beam & a balloon middle & latter
part much the same as the first men employed So ends these
24 ours

Lat. 3° 56' South
Long. 178° 26' West

Thursday - 5th 1852

Corn with a calm middle part a light wind from the
westward steering N by E latter part much the same
men employed

Lat. 3° 17' South

Friday - 6th 1852

Corn with light west only wind Ship heading N by E
middle part much the same latter part a strong westerly
wind with squalls & rain heading WSW So ends these
24 ours

Saturday - 7th 1852

Corn with a strong westerly wind squally heading
W middle part light wind latter part much the same
So ends these 24 ours

Sunday - 8th 1852

Corn with light wind from the NE heading N at 2 o'clock
Spoke the Ship George Washington middle part a strong
breeze at 6 AM latter part saw Lope Island heading N by W
Lat. 2° 42' South

Monday - 9th 1852

Corn with a strong breeze from the NE heading N by W
middle & latter part much the same as the first at noon
Saw Lope Island on the weather beam men employed

Tuesday - 10th 1852

Corn with a strong breeze from the ESE steering South
at 6 o'clock the main top sail middle & latter part the same
as first squally at 7 saw a sail on the weather beam
men employed So ends these 24 ours
