Came with a light ENE wind heading SE fine weather middle and latter part of these 24 hours past with light wind from the ENE heading SE men employed breaking out cooping the provisions

Long. 177 30 East

Thursday 18 1852

Came with a light E wind heading SSE at 5 cleared the decks middle and latter part of these 24 hours passed with a moderate E wind heading SSE men variously employed

Lat. 00 44 South

Friday 19 1852

Came with a moderate E wind heading SSE saw black fish at 11 o'clock boat ship heading North middle part at 3 boat ship heading SE light wind latter part the same men employed So ends these 24 hours

Lat. 02 07 South

Saturday 20 1852

Long. 177 09 East

Came with a light wind from the ENE heading SE at 3 o'clock saw hope Island middle part light wind standing off & on the land at 7 in the morning commencing recruiting ship latter part light wind So ends these 24 hours

Sunday 21 1852

Came with a light ENE wind standing off & on the land at 1 o'clock stood off heading SE land bore N 20 W middle & latter part of these 24 hours much the same as the first at 11 o'clock saw Whales boats lowered the larkid boat got fast

Lat. 03 06 South

Monday 22 1852

Came with light ENE wind boats in too set & got the whale long side at 8 set the watch middle part squally at day light commencing cutting at 12 finished So ends these 24 hours

March Tuesday 23 1852

Came with a light NE wind commenced trying out at 6 shortened sail & set the watch middle part light wind & squally latter part in moderate breeze men employed trying out

Lat. 4 04 South

Wednesday 24 1852

Long. 178 05 East

Came with a moderate breeze from the ENE heading N middle part of these 24 hours light wind trying out at 6 10 PM saw whales boats lowered the larkid boat got fast at 12 got the whale long side

Thursday 25 1852

Came with a light ENE wind cutting in at 4. Can squally at 6 finished the larkid middle part light wind latter part light finished cutting So ends these 24 hours

Lat. 3 52 South

Long. 176 07 East

Friday 26 1852

Came with a light ENE wind at 5 o'clock spoke the brig water watch middle part light wind latter part much the same employed trying out So ends these 24 hours

Saturday March 27 1852

Came with a light NE wind at 3 o'clock gaming with brig middle part light wind latter part the same finish boiling So ends these 24 hours

Sunday March 28 1852

Came with a light breeze from the NE heading ESE at 3 o'clock ~~boats~~ the brig's boat can long side middle part light wind latter part much the same So ends these 24 hours
