

Monday March 29th 1852

Came with a moderate breeze from the N.W. heading East under all sail middle and latter part much the same as the first men employed Stowing down So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday March 30th 1852

Came with light winds from the E.N.E. heading North at 5 Saw whales but too late to lower middle & latter part much the same as first finished Stowing down So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday March 31th 1852

Came with a light wind from the E.N.E. heading North at 5 o'clock Calm Squally at 6 Shortened sail & wear ship heading S.E. middle & latter part fresh breeze at 8 AM Saw Whales going quick to windward men employ

Thursday April 1st 1852

Came with a light breeze from the N.E. heading E.S.E. at 3 o'clock Saw the brig water witch middle & latter part much the same as the first men employed

Friday April 2nd 1852

Came with a light breeze from the N.E. heading E.S.E. at 5 received Tack of head from the brig at 7 Strong breeze & Squally middle & latter part Strong breeze & Squally So ends these 24 hours

Saturday April 3rd 1852

Came with a strong E.N.E. wind and Squally at 3 o'clock doubled reef the top sails middle & latter part much the same as the first men employed So ends these 24 hours

Lat. 4. 23 South

Sunday April 4th 1852

Came with a light breeze from the E.N.E. heading N at 4 Spoke the ship roseom middle and latter part of these 24 hours past with a strong E. wind So ends these 24 hours

Monday April 5th 1852

Came with a strong E. wind heading N.W. at 5 o'clock boat Ship heading S.E. middle and latter part of these 24 hours a moderate breeze men employed mending sails & soon

Tuesday April 6th 1852

Came with a light E.N.E. wind heading N. Light Squalls middle & latter part much the same as the first men employed mending sails So ends these 24 hours

Lat. 4. 00 South

Long 175. 06 East

Wednesday April 7th 1852

Came with a light S.E. wind heading E.N.E. light Squalls middle & latter part light wind men employed So ends

Long 175. 19 East

Thursday April 8th 1852

Came with a calm middle part Calm at day light a light breeze sprang up from the E.N.E. heading North latter part light wind men employed So ends these 24 hours
