 Came with light breeze from the N^W heading ESE at 4 o'clock
 bent it into sail middle & latter part Calm So
 ends these 24 hours
 Lat. 4.37 South
 Long. 176.11 East

Monday April 12th 1852
 Came with a Calm middle & latter part of these 24
 hours past with light wind from the N^W heading ESE
 men employed mending sails So ends these
 Lat. 5.38 South
 Long. 176.20 East

Tuesday April 13th 1852
 Came with a light N^W wind heading ESE at 5 o'clock
 bent ship heading N^W middle part and latter much
 the same at daylight saw the Ship Atlantic
 men employed So ends these 24 hours
 Lat. 5.24 South
 Long. 176.20 East

Wednesday April 14th 1852
 Came with a light wind from the N^W heading E
 middle & latter part light wind men employed
 Lat. 5.06 South
 Long. 176.07 East

Thursday April 15th 1852
 Came with a light wind from the W steering N^W by E
 middle & latter part Squally So past these 24 hours

Friday April 16th 1852
 Came with light Westly wind steering N^W by E middle part
 light wind & Squally latter part a light wind from the
 N heading ESE Ship in sight men employed
 Lat. 4.39 South
 Long. 177.40 East

Saturday April 17th 1852
 Came with a light N^W wind heading N^W middle part
 light wind latter part a strong wind from the W steering
 N^W by E Squally So ends these 24 hours

Sunday April 18th 1852
 Came with a moderate W wind steering N^W middle
 part a strong W wind & Squally steering N^W by E the
 latter a moderate breeze from the N^W heading E
 So past these 24 hours
 Lat. 3.03 South
 Long. 179.30 East

Monday April 19th 1852
 Came with a moderate N^W wind heading E bent
 ship at 1 o'clock heading N^W middle & latter part of these
 24 hours past much the same as the first men employed
 Lat. 2.11 South
 Long. 178.50 East

Tuesday April 20th 1852
 Came with a light East wind heading N^W saw a Spout
 middle & latter part much the same as the first at 8 o'clock
 spoke the bark Gasper So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday April 21st 1852
 Came with a light wind from the ESE heading N^W middle
 & latter part of these 24 hours past with light wind steering
 W^W men employed So ends these 24 hours
 Lat. 1.43 South
 Long. 177.45 East

Thursday April 22nd 1852
 Came with light breeze from the ESE steering N^W by W
 at 2 o'clock saw L'An Island middle & latter part
 of these 24 hours past with light wind leaving of and on
 the land getting recruits So ends these 24 hours
