Came with light wind from the N<sup>W</sup> lying off and on the land at 2 Saw a Ship to windward at 4 Stood off the land middle & latter part just with light wind Saw a Sail on the weather beam So ends these 24 hours  
Lat 2<sup>nd</sup> 12 South  
Long 177<sup>th</sup> 30 East

Saturday April 24<sup>th</sup> 1852  
Came with a light N<sup>W</sup> wind heading E at 2 o'clock Saw the land hope Island middle & latter part of these 24 hours just with light wind hope Island in Sight So ends with fine weather

Sunday April 25<sup>th</sup> 1852  
Came with light wind from the E<sup>SE</sup> heading SE middle & latter part of these 24 hours just with light  
Lat 3<sup>rd</sup> 40 South  
Long 177<sup>th</sup> 47 East

Monday April 26<sup>th</sup> 1852  
Came with light & squally from the N<sup>W</sup> heading East middle & latter part much the same men employed  
So ends these 24 hours  
Lat 4<sup>th</sup> 30 South  
Long 177<sup>th</sup> 26 East

Tuesday April 27<sup>th</sup> 1852  
Came with a moderate breeze from the E<sup>SE</sup> heading SE at 6 wore Ship & Stood North middle & latter part of these 24 hours just with a moderate breeze men employed  
Lat 3<sup>rd</sup> 25 South  
Long 177<sup>th</sup> 25 East

Wednesday April 28<sup>th</sup> 1852  
Came with a moderate breeze from the E<sup>SE</sup> heading N<sup>W</sup> middle & latter part much the same as the first men employed So ends these 24 hours  
Lat 1<sup>st</sup> 53 South  
Long 177<sup>th</sup> 14 East

Thursday April 29<sup>th</sup> 1852  
Came with a light wind from the N<sup>W</sup> heading N<sup>W</sup> at 6 backed the maintop sail middle part same as the first at daylight Saw Lyrae Island latter part light wind men employed So ends these 24 hours

Friday April 30<sup>th</sup> 1852  
Came with a light N<sup>W</sup> wind Ship Standing off and on the land at 5 Stood off heading N<sup>W</sup> middle and latter part of these 24 hours just the same as the first men employed So on  
Lat 00<sup>th</sup> 35 South

Saturday May 1<sup>st</sup> 1852  
Came with light N<sup>W</sup> wind at 6 backed the maintop sail middle part light wind at daylight latter part Ship Steering N<sup>W</sup> Saw a Ship on the barbed beam men employed mending Sails So ends these 24 hours  
Lat 00<sup>th</sup> 03 South

Sunday May 2<sup>nd</sup> 1852  
Came with a light E wind Steering N<sup>W</sup> at 6 backed the main top sail middle & latter part much the same as the first at noon Saw Simson Island So ends these 24 hours  
Lat 00<sup>th</sup> 34 South

Monday May 3<sup>rd</sup> 1852  
Came with a light N<sup>W</sup> wind Steering S<sup>W</sup> middle part light wind hove Ship at 2 o'clock heading N at daylight Saw the land hove Ship heading SE latter part light wind men employed mending Sails So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday May 4<sup>th</sup> 1852  
Came with a light E<sup>SE</sup> wind Steering N at 6 hove to the wind heading SE off Wooded Island middle part light wind hove Ship at 3 o'clock latter part much the same at 11 Saw the land men employed mending Sails So ends these 24 hours
