 sight 30 miles off middle and latter part of these 24 hours
 past with light wind and squally men employed
 Lat 3rd 46 North

Saturday July 3rd 1852
 Come with a light SE wind Ship steering N by E
 middle and latter part of these 24 hours past with light
 wind and squally men employed

Sunday July 4th 1852
 Come with a light W wind Ship heading N by W the
 land in sight at 4 o'clock a disturbance commenced
 Charles Kine came aft the main mast and in salted
 the mate the mate ordered him forward but he did not
 go the mate took hold of him to shure him forward when
 Steward interfered the Steward told man and gave
 it to them Charles Kine and Wm Johnson
 So ends the 24 hours

Monday July 5th 1852
 Come with a strong breeze and squally from the
 W by W Ship steering NW middle & latter part of these
 24 hours past with light wind men employed

Tuesday July 6th 1852
 Come with a light W wind steering SSW middle
 and latter part much the same as the first
 men employed So ends these 24 hours
 Lat 3rd 59 North
 Long 163rd 57 East

Wednesday July 7th 1852
 Come with a light E wind steering SSW middle
 and latter part much the same as the first
 men employed So ends these 24 hours

Thursday July 8th 1852
 Come with a light ESE wind Ship steering SSW
 middle and latter part just as the first men
 employed So ends these 24 hours
 Lat 1st 52 North
 Long 163rd East

Friday July 9th 1852
 Come with a light SE wind steering SSW Saw a
 finback middle and latter part of these 24 hours past
 with light wind men employed So ends these
 Lat 1st 11 North
 Long 162nd 11 East

Saturday July 10th 1852
 Come with a light E wind Ship steering SW
 middle and latter part much the same as the first men
 employed So ends these 24 hours
 Lat 26th North
 Long 160th 26 East

Sunday July 11th 1852
 Come with a light E wind Ship steering W by S at 6
 bore to with the main top sail aback middle &
 latter part much the same as the first So ends
 these 24 hours
 Lat 00th 6 South
 Long 160th 1 East

Monday July 12th 1852
 Come a light wind from the ESE heading S middle
 and latter part of these 24 hours past with a fresh
 breeze men employed
 Lat 00th 02 North
 Long 160th 27 East

Tuesday July 13th 1852
 Come with a fresh breeze from the SE heading E by E
 middle and latter part of these 24 hours past with light
 wind men employed
 Lat 00th 03 North
 Long 161st 06 East

Wednesday July 14th 1852
 Come with a light NE wind Ship heading N by W middle
 and latter part much the same as the first men employed
 So ends these 24 hours
 Lat 1st 02 North
 Long 160th 59 East
