Friday August 13[#] 1852
 Come with a light E wind Ship heading SSE
 middle and latter part much the same as the first
 men employed mending Sails So ends these 24 hours
 Lat 2° 56' North
 Long 176° 14' East

Saturday August 14[#] 1852
 Come with a light wind from the ESE Ship heading So
 at 6 o'clock boat Ship heading N by E middle and latter
 part past with light winds and squalls. So ends these
 24 hours Lat 3° 06' North
 Long 176° 49' East

Sunday August 15[#] 1852
 Come with a light variable wind and squally
 middle and latter part of these 24 hours past with light
 wind and squally from the S Ship heading ESE
 Lat 2° 54' North
 Long 178° 11' East

Monday August 16[#] 1852
 Come with a light SSE wind Ship heading E middle and
 latter part much the same as the first at 9 A.M. Saw
 Whales boats lowered but the Starbird boat Steerer mist
 boats came on board So ends these 24 hours Lat
 Long 178° 40' East

Tuesday August 17[#] 1852
 Come with a light S wind Ship heading ESE boats in
 Chase at 8 Com on board middle and latter part Calm
 men employed mending Sails So ends these 24 hours
 Lat 3° 02' South

Wednesday August 18[#] 1852
 Come with a calm middle part a breeze Sprung up
 from the E Ship heading SSE latter part light breeze
 men variously employed Lat 2° 59' North
 Long 179° 33' East

Thursday August 19[#] 1852
 Come with a light E wind Ship heading SSE middle
 and latter part of these 24 hours past with light wind
 men employed Lat 1° 28' North
 Long 178° 42' East

Friday August 20[#] 1852
 Come with a Strong breeze from the E heading SSE
 middle and latter part ends with a Strong breeze from
 the ESE Ship heading SE men employed Lat 0° 06' South
 Long 179° 08' East

Saturday August 21[#] 1852
 Come with a Strong winds from the ESE Ship heading
 SE middle and latter part much the same as the first
 men employed Lat 1° 42' South
 Long 179° 12' East

Sunday August 22[#] 1852
 Come with a Strong breeze from the ESE Ship heading SE
 middle and latter part of these 24 hours past with a Strong breeze
 Lat 1° 30' 24' South
 Long 178° 11' East

Monday August 23[#] 1852
 Come with a light breeze from the ESE Ship heading SE
 at 5 o'clock Saw Whales middle and latter part past
 with a light wind men employed So ends these 24 hours
 Lat 3° 48' South

Tuesday August 24[#] 1852
 Come with a light ESE wind Ship heading E middle and
 latter part much the same as the first men employed
 Lat 4° 04' South
 Long 178° 56' East
