

Wednesday Oct 13th 1852
 Came with a moderate breeze from the ENE Ship in chase
 at 4 Commenced cutting in at 6 finished at 7 Set the watch middle part
 light wind employed cutting blubber at 8 AM Commenced towing out
 So ends these 24 hours
 Lat. 44° 44' South
 Long 167° 14' East

Thursday Oct 14th 1852
 Came with a light wind from the NE Ship heading ESE towing
 out at 5 Saw Ocean Island middle and latter part of these 24
 hours past with light wind towing out
 Lat. 44° 16' South
 Long 167° 26' East

Friday Oct 15th 1852
 Came with a light wind from the ESE Ship heading NE finished
 towing out middle and latter part light wind at 6 PM Saw Whales
 boats lowered two boats got fast but unsuccessful got men
 So ends this days work land in sight

Saturday Oct 16th 1852
 Came with a light wind from the ESE Ship in chase at 3 Saw
 Whales spoke the Ship coming Morgan and latter middle and
 latter part light wind Ship steering N at 10 AM Saw two
 sails on the lee bow men vigorously employed
 Lat. 42° 42' South
 Long 168° 22' East

Sunday Oct 17th 1852
 Came with a light ESE wind Ship heading NE Ocean Island in
 sight middle and latter part light wind from the ENE Ship
 going SE So ends these 24 hours

Monday Oct 18th 1852
 Came with a light wind from the E Ship heading N three
 ships in sight middle and latter part of these 24 hours past
 with light winds from the NE Ship heading ESE men
 employed Stowing down
 Lat. 40° 02' North
 Long 169° 11' East

Tuesday Oct 19th 1852
 Came with a light wind from the NE Ship heading ESE
 finished Stowing down Ship in sight middle and latter part
 a moderate breeze from the NE Ship going ESE men
 employed So ends these 24 hours
 Lat. 40° 45' South
 Long 169° 21' East

Wednesday Oct 20th 1852
 Came with a light wind from the NE Ship heading
 ESE Ocean Island in sight middle and latter much the
 same as the first at sail in sight men employed
 mending sails So ends these 24 hours
 Lat. 40° 52' South
 Long 169° 15' East

Thursday Oct 21st 1852
 Came with a calm at 7 came a light breeze from the
 ESE heading E middle and latter part light and small
 men employed So ends these 24 hours

Friday Oct 22nd 1852
 Came with a strong breeze from the ESE Ship steering
 E at 6 detached reef the top sails
 middle and latter part much the same
 as the first men employed So ends these 24 hours
 Lat. 40° 05' South
 Long 169° 16' East

Saturday Oct 23rd 1852
 Came with a moderate breeze and squally from
 the ENE Ship steering E middle part light wind
 steering E latter part NE wind Ship heading NE at 6
 boat Ship heading W men employed
 Lat. 40° 45' South
 Long 170° 52' East

Sunday Oct 24th 1852
 Came with a light wind from the NE Ship heading
 W middle and latter part of these 24 hours past with
 light wind from the NE Ship heading W at 9 Saw
 the land Ocean Island
 Lat. 40° 36' South
 Long 169° 59' East
