

Monday, Oct 25th 1832

Came with a light wind from the N.W. Ship steering S.W.
at 1 Saw a Ship to windward whaling at 3 Saw Whales
at 5 one boat lowered but too late
middle part light wind spoke the Ship  Elizabeth with
two Whales latter part strong breeze and squally steering
to land in sight so ends these 24 hours Lat 11.59 South

Tuesday Oct 26th 1832

Came with a strong breeze from the N.W. Ship heading
N.E. three ships in sight at 6 Shorten sail middle and latter
part calm the land in sight men employed mending sails
Lat 11.54 South
Long 168.28 East

Wednesday Oct 27th 1832

Came with a calm at 3 Saw Spouts middle and latter
part light wind & Ship in sight men employed variously
so ends these 24 hours
Lat 11.50 South
Long 170.13 East

Thursday Oct 28th 1832

Came with a light wind from the S.W. heading W.
at 4 Saw Whales boats lowered but did not suck but
at 6 returned an hour middle and  latter part
light wind from the S.W. heading W. men employed
the land in sight Lat

Friday Oct 29th 1832

Came with a light wind from the S.W. Ship standing
in the land at 1 o'clock one went on shore to get
meats middle part strong breeze and squally from
the N.W. Ship heading S latter part strong breeze steering
N men employed

Saturday Oct 30th 1832

Came with a light breeze from the N.W. Ship steering N
under dudded reef top sails middle and latter part
much the same as the first men employed

Lat 11.14 North
Long 171.01 East

Sunday Oct 31st 1832

Came with a light wind from the N.W. Ship going
S squally weather middle and latter part of these 24
hours past with strong winds and squally from the W
Lat 11.09 South

Monday Nov 1st 1832

Came with a strong wind and squally ship
heading S.W. under short sail middle part light
wind at daylight steering S by S latter part strong in
squalls men employed mending sails

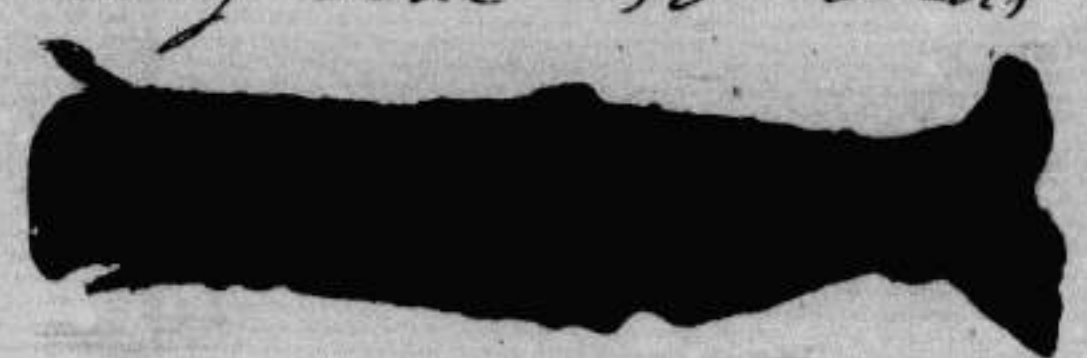
Tuesday Nov 2nd 1832

Came with a light wind and squally from the
N.W. Ship steering S by S at 6 wind hauled to the
N.W. middle and latter part of these 24 hours past
with a light wind ship steering S men employed
Lat 11.30 South
Long 173.02 East

Wednesday Nov 3rd 1832

Came with a moderate breeze from the N.W. Ship
steering S middle and latter part of these 24 hours
past with light wind at 11 PM Saw black fish men
employed making boat sails
Lat 11.35 South
Long 173.32 East

Thursday Nov 4th 1832

Came with a light wind from the N.W. Ship steering S middle
latter part light variable wind at 9 AM Saw black fish
at 11 Saw Whales two boats lowered the Whales boat got
fast at 8 got Whale long side so ends these 24 hours
 Lat 11.36 South
Long 174.16 East

Friday Nov 5th 1832

Came with a light wind from the N.W. Ship in chase
middle part light wind and squally at daylight commenced
cutting in at 2 finished men employed
Lat 11.18 South
Long 174.48 East
