

Ship Herald Lying in The Port

Tuesday July 19th 1853

This Day commences with light Easterly wind and pleasant weather Ship Company came on board and commenced work consisting of 2 Mates and 6 Seamen. where of Chief H. Harlow is 1st Mate

Wednesday July 20th

Day Comm with light Easterly wind and fair weather took 15 tons of fresh water on board last part of Sails and Discharge of Casks of Oil

Thursday July 21st

Comm with light plains and fair weather employed fitting ship for sea and taking stores on board day ends the same

Friday July 22^d

This day light wind from the East and very warm employed fitting ship for sea took on board 200 lbs of pork for Water Day with S.W. winds

Saturday July 23^d

Commences with light southerly winds and pleasant employed fitting ship for sea ends the same

Sunday 24th

Commences with light S.W. winds and ends with strong breeze from the same quarter

Monday July 25th

This day strong S.W. winds and cloudy employed getting ready for sea &c &c

Tuesday July 26th

Strong S.W. Wind and rain took 2 Horses and 2 Cows on board

Wednesday July 27

Heavy Gail from S.W. with rain employed fitting for sea This day Porting 12 hours so ends the Harbor Day
