

Wednesday August 26th 1835-

First Part of these 24 hours light winds from the S.W. and fine weather. Middle and latter Parts Calm and black fish lowered our boats. Did not get fast steering S. S. East by compass so Enos Latd -- Long --

Thursday August 27th 1835-

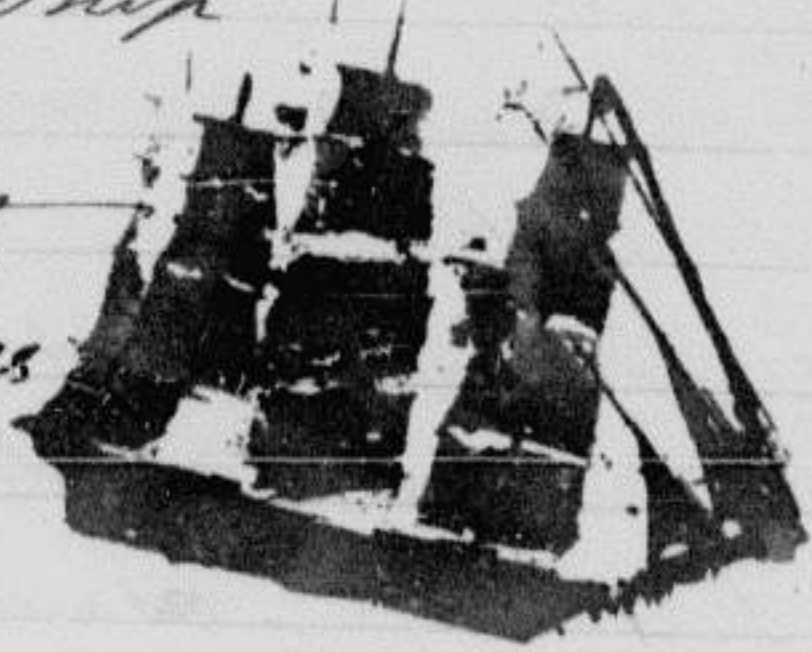
All these 24 hours fresh breezes from S. S. East with frequent squalls of Rain. Bore S. S. E. Dist- 3 Leagues. Saw the Island of Fayall bearing S. S. East Course South East by South all hands Employed in ships Duty so Enos Latd -- 38. 45 N Long --

Friday August 28th 1835-

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes with frequent squalls of Rain. Middle and latter Parts light breezes and clear weather. saw two ships standing to the southward and eastward at 4 A.M. Fayall bore S. S. East Dist- 8 Leagues all hands Employed in ships Duty so Enos Latd -- Long --

Saturday August 29th 1835-

All these 24 hours light breezes and clear weather. At 2 P.M. went on shore at Fayall ship lying off and on in company with the Frederick Augustus of New Port Rhoccolane so Enos these 24 hours Latd -- Long --



Sunday August 30th 1835-

First and middle parts of these 24 hours light winds and clear weather still lying off and on the harbour in company with the ships Henry arder of Hudson N.Y. and Frederick Augustus of New Port R.I. Left one man and shipped 2 more men at 6 P.M. sailed away for the Cape Verde Islands so Enos Latd -- Long --

Monday August 31st 1835-

All these 24 hours strong breezes and clear weather. At 2 P.M. saw the Island of Terceira bearing S. East Dist- 3 Leagues At 10 A.M. St. Michael's bore S. East 7 miles Dist- 20 Enos Latd -- 37. 54 N Long -- 25. 30 West

Tuesday Sept- 1st 1835-

All these 24 hours fresh breezes the S. and clear weather. Set steering sails all hands Employed in ships Duty steering S. by West by compass saw two ships steering to the South so Enos Latd 36. 32 N Long --

Wednesday Sept- 2^d 1835-

First and middle Parts fresh breezes from the S. with latter Parts the same with frequent squalls of Rain. one of the crew a portague ~~was~~ is deranged so that we have to confine him steering S. S. West by compass so Enos Latd -- 32. 27 North Long --

Thursday Sept- 3^d 1835-

First and middle Parts fresh breezes from the S.W. with frequent squalls of Rain. latter Parts clear weather with all sail set steering South by West so Enos Latd -- Long --

Friday Sept- 4th 1835-

All these 24 hours pleasant breezes and clear weather. spoke bark Frederick of New Port bound round Cape Horn Capt. (Swining) saw a ship steering S. S. West. Enos by compass so Enos Latd 28. 02 North Long --

Saturday Sept- 5th 1835-

All these 24 hours light breezes and pleasant weather. saw the bark Frederick and Henry arder of Hudson all hands Employed in ships Duty steering S. West by South by compass so Enos Latd -- 26. 55 North Long --
