

Thursday Oct 29th 1835

All these 24 hours fine Breezes from the North and cloudy weather steering East by Compass saw 3 Right whales (Down Boats did not get fast to any so Enes. Lat. 33. 57 South

Long

Friday Oct. 30th 1835

First part of these 24 hours strong Breezes from the North middle part the same latter Part winds from the south with a heavy sea running steering East by Compass at 9 A.M. took in top Gallant sails and Jib and Double Reefed our top sails so Enes. Lat. 33. 32 South Long.

Saturday Oct 31st 1835

All these 24 hours fresh Gales from the E. East steering East under Double Reefed top sails all hands Employed in ship Duty saw 3 sails so Enes. Lat. By Obs. 31. 33. South Long.

Sunday Nov 1st 1835

All these 24 hours strong Breezes with frequent squalls of Rain set the Jib and shook the Reefs from the top sails saw Black fish saw a ship Boiling so Enes there 24 hours Lat. 32. 42 South Long.

Remarks on Board Monday Nov. 2^d 1835

First part of these 24 hours moderate Breezes and cloudy weather Middle and latter fine weather 3 ships in sight at 8 A.M. saw Black fish lowered our Boats and got 4 of them 2 to the starboard and 2 to the Weather Boats winds S.E. East so Enes. Lat. By Obs. 31. 48 South Long.

Tuesday Nov 3^d 1835

All these 24 hours light winds from the south one ship in sight at 2 P.M. backed to the Eastward Caught a porpoise and Boiled out the Black fish so Enes. Lat. 31. 34 South Long.

Wednesday Nov 4th 1835

All these 24 hours light winds from the south saw a number of fin Backs whales saw 2 ships standing to the Eastward all hands Employed in repairing sails so Enes. Lat. 31. 58 South Long.

Thursday Nov 5th 1835

All these 24 hours light Breezes and pleasant weather steering E. North all hands Employed in ship Duty so Enes. Lat. By Obs. 33. 06 South Long.

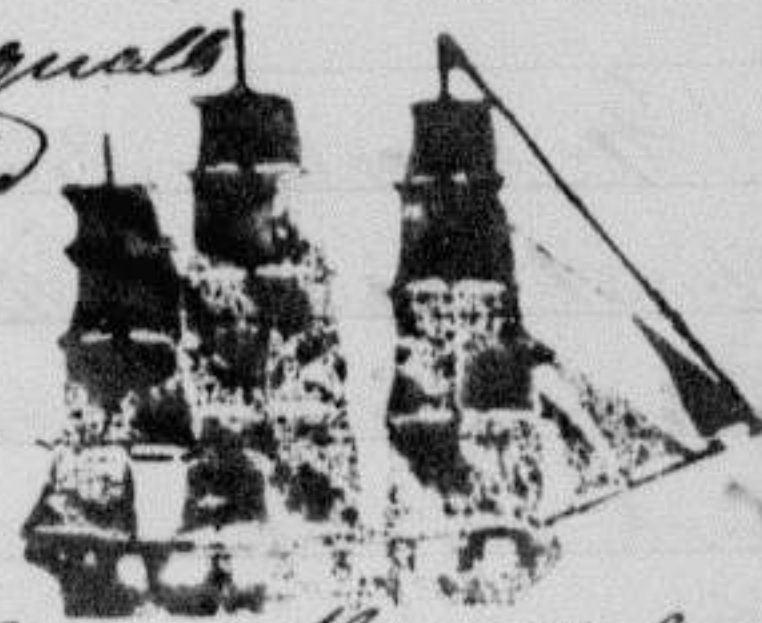
Friday Nov 6th 1835

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the North middle and latter Part strong Breezes at 4 P.M. saw 2 Right whales (Down Boats) starboard Boat struck one starboard killed it at 6 P.M. commenced cutting in the whale so Enes. Lat. 33. 40.9. Long.



Remarks on Board Saturday Nov 7th 1835

All these 24 hours fresh Breezes with squalls of Rain spoke ship side Capt Townsend No Oil also ship Comd Perry Capt Hogan with 4 whales at 1 A.M. saw a whale (Down Boats did not get fast all hands Employed in Boiling oil so Enes there 24 hours Lat. By Obs. 33. 32 South Long. Here from ship Emerald Capt Norton Nov 6th saw 3 Right whales



Sunday Nov 8th 1835

All these 24 hours fresh Breezes from the south steering East at 4 P.M. finished Boiling hove to and stood Boats crew saw a number of finback whales so Enes. there 24 hours Lat. 33. 35 South Long.

Monday Nov 9th 1835

All these 24 hours strong Breezes from the south steering E. S. E. at 8 A.M. spoke ship David of Lynn Capt Mitty with 200 lbs of Right whale and 300 sperm all hands Employed in stowing down oil so Enes. Lat. Long.
