

Sunday Novr 22nd 1835

All these 24 hours light winds from the westward and fine weather steering S. East By compass so Over these 24 hours Lat. 37. 17 South Long. 38. 00 East

Monday Novr 23rd 1835

All these 24 hours light winds from the North at 2 P.M. Lowered our Boats and caught 4 Black fish 2 to the starboard & to the Larboard and one to the Main Boats so Over Lat By Ob. 37. 47 South

Long By Chron. 38. 50 East

Tuesday Novr 24th 1835

All these 24 hours strong winds from the south steering East By South the watch employed in boiling the Black fish oil at 6 A.M. took in fore and main top sails a very bad sea running so Over Lat 38. 20 South

Long By Chron 37. 50 East

Wednesday Novr 25th 1835

All these 24 hours strong winds from the North steering E. S. E. By compass at 6 P.M. Reaped the top sails Latter Parts a very heavy sea Luffed to the wind under close Reaped top sails so Over Lat 38. 22 South Long 41. 10 E.

Thursday Novr 26th 1835

First part of these 24 hours A heavy Gale from E. N. East Middle and Latter Parts moderate at 4 P.M. made sail on the ship steering E. S. East By compass so Over Lat By Ob. 38. 30 South Long By Chron. 42. 00 East

Friday Novr 27th 1835

First part of these 24 hours light winds from N. N. E. At 3 P.M. set in thick with a strong wind and Rain at 6 P.M. took in the light sails at 8 P.M. Reaped the top sails at 8 took in the fore and main sail At 10 P.M. experienced very heavy squalls furled fore and main top sails and Luffed to the wind under close Reaped main top sail fore top mast main and main stay sails so Over

Lat 38. 50 South Long By Chron. 48. 27 East

Saturday Novr 28th 1835

First part of these 24 hours cloudy weather and light winds from the West; Middle and Latter Parts strong Breeze and clear weather steering East By compass so Over these 24 hours Lat. 36. 56 South Long. 49. 00 East

Remarks on Board Sunday Novr 29th 1835

All these 24 hours strong Breeze from the N. West with a heavy sea at 4 A.M. shook the keels from the top sails and set top Gallant sails At 7 A.M. saw 3 right whales (Down Boats Larboard and Main Boats each got a whale and took them along side and cut them in so Over these 24 hours Lat By Ob. 36. 20 South Long. 52. 10 East



Monday Novr 30th 1835

First part of these 24 hours strong Breeze with frequent squalls of Rain at 6 P.M. finished cutting the whales at 9 P.M. commenced boiling 2 ships in sight so Over Lat By Ob. 36. 36 South Long 51. 49 East

Tuesday Decr 1st 1835

All these 24 hours strong Breeze with frequent squalls of Rain At 6 P.M. Reaped ship to the Eastward all hands employed in boiling oil so Over Lat By Ob. 36. 42 South Long By Chron. 52. 45 East

Wednesday Decr 2nd 1835

First part of these 24 hours strong winds attended with heavy thunder squalls cooled down the work Middle and Latter Parts clear weather commencing boiling again so Over these 24 hours Lat. 36. 28 South Long. 52. 56 East

Thursday Decr 3rd 1835

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the West N. West saw a large school of Black fish at 4 P.M. finished boiling and fell away E. N. East standing Boats crew at daylight Reaped ship to the westward and commenced stowing down oil so Over Lat 36. 06 South Long 53. 45 East
