

Friday Decr 4th 1835

First part of these 24 hours strong Breeze from the North at 6 P.M. finished stowing Down oil and Veere's ship to Eastward and stood Boat crews at daylight made sail steering East By N. Variation 2 1/2 Points so Enos Lat 35.40 South Long 54.55 East -

Saturday Decr 5th 1835

All these 24 hours light winds from the S. West steering E. S. East By Compass saw nothing all hands Employed in Repairing sails unless the blue main top sail and Bent a new one so Enos Lat By Obs - 35.06 South Long By Chron 56.10 East

Sunday Decr 6th 1835

First part of these 24 hours calm Middle and latter Part light winds from the westward steering East By South By Compass 2 Points Variation saw a ship steering East S. East so Enos Lat - 35.47 South Long 57.54 East

Monday Decr 7th 1835

All these 24 hours light winds and fine weather steering East By N. Caught a porpoise so Enos there 24 hours Lat By Obs - 36.00 South Long By Chron 60.40 East

Tuesday Decr 8th 1835

Continues light westerly winds and fine weather steering S. East By E. 1/2 East By Compass the watch Employed in ship's Duty so Enos Lat By Obs - 36.07 South

Long By Chron 64.04 East

Wednesday Decr 9th 1835

All these 24 hours light westerly winds and fine weather steering East at 11.

A.M. Hauled a school of Right whales Down Boat Larboard and White Boats each killed a whale Starboard Boat killed 1 and sunk two so Enos there 24 hours

Thursday Decr 10th 1835

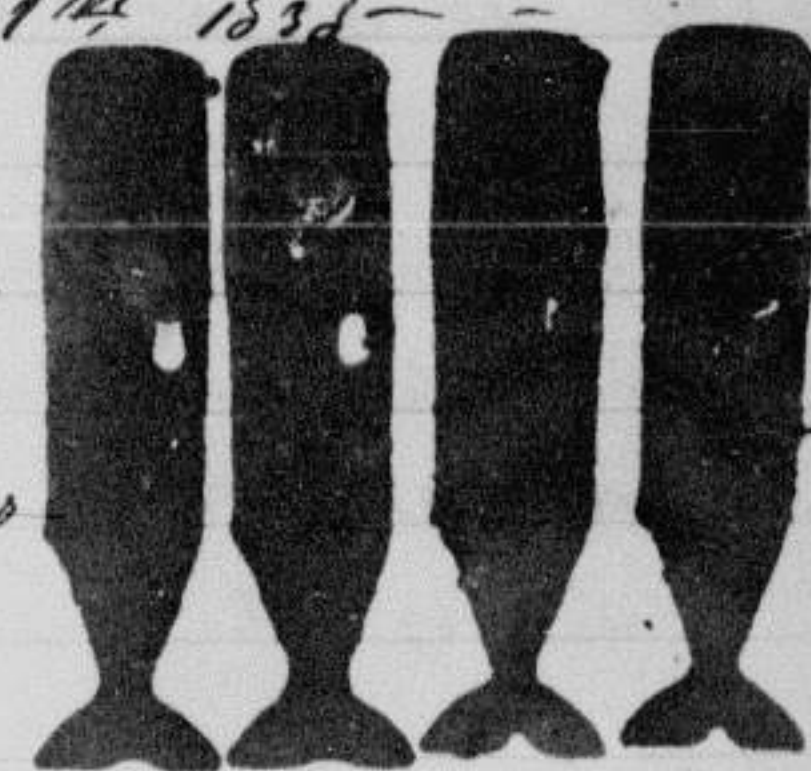
All these 24 hours fine weather took our whales along side and cut them in saw a number more at 7 A.M. (Down Boat Larboard Boat struck iron (Drawee) White Boat struck and killed and sunk a whale so Enos there 24 hours Lat By Obs - 36.11 South

Long By Chron 65.31 East

Friday Decr 11th 1835

These 24 hours commences with light winds and pleasant weather saw Right whales Down Boat Larboard Boat struck iron (Drawee) came on Board at 11 A.M. saw sperm whales Down Boats all got fast and killed 4 took them along side so Enos there 24 hours

Lat By Obs - 36.10 South Long By Chron 65.30 East



Saturday Decr 12th 1835

First of these 24 hours strong Breeze at 1 P.M. commenced cutting and put in two of them Middle and latter Parts much the same (Double flookee) Repeat the whales that lay along side so Enos Lat By Obs - 35.45 South

Long By Chron - 65.28 East

Sunday Decr 13th 1835

These 24 hours commences with heavy Gales and cloudy weather all hands Employed in Baling and stowing Down oil winds from S. East so Enos Lat By Obs - 35.25 South

Long - 65.30 East

Monday Decr 14th 1835

Still continues heavy Gales with a heavy sea all hands Employed in Baling two whales still along side winds from the Eastward so Enos Lat 35.05 South Long 65.15 E.

Tuesday Decr 15th 1835

First and middle part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S. West at 2 P.M. kept the ship off before the wind and commenced cutting the whales that lay along side cut in their Bodies and lost their heads latter Part commenced more moderate so Enos there 24 hours
