All these 24 hours calm saw nothing remarkable
finished boiling oil so Enos Latd 33.03 South
Long 65.35 East

Thursday Decr 17th 1835

These 24 hours commences with light winds and pleasant
weather all hands employed in stowing down
oil so Enos these 24 hours Latd By Ob - 35.11 South
Long By Chron - 65.49 East

Friday Decr 18th 1835

First part of these 24 hours light winds and fine weather
finished stowing down oil so Enos these 24 hours
Latd By Ob - 35.13 South Long By Chron - 66.35 East

Saturday Decr 19th 1835

First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes and fine
weather middle and latter parts strong winds from
the westward steering E. By South 1/2 South By Compass
so Enos Latd 35.53 South Long 68.55 East

Sunday Decr 20th 1835

All these 24 hours strong winds from the westward
with squalls of rain steering ^{S.E.} By Compass at 7 P.M.
took in the fore and main top Gallant sails so Enos
these 24 hours Latd - 36.54 South Long - 72.30 East

Monday Decr 21st 1835

First part of these 24 hours strong E. West winds and
squally weather steering E. East By Compass squalls
increased shortened sail and took in the main Boat
on Deck latter parts more moderate so Enos
Latd By Ob - 37.52 South Long By Chron - 76.03 East

Tuesday Decr 22^d 1835

First part of these 24 hours more moderate middle
parts light winds latter part strong winds and pleasant
weather at 4 P.M. made the Island St Pauls and
amsterdam At 11 P.M. hoisted a boat and went on
shore fishing so Enos Latd - 38.47 South Long - 77.53 E.

Wednesday Decr 23^d 1835

still continues strong breezes ship lying off
and on the Island At 11 A.M. the Boat came on
Board with a great quantity of fish made sail
on the ship steering East By South so Enos these 24 hours
Latd By Ob - 38.10 South Long 77.56 East

Thursday Decr 24th 1835

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the
S. West with a thick atmosphere middle parts much
the same latter parts light winds and good weather
steering East By N. so Enos Latd By Ob - 37.50 South
Long By Chron - 79.05 East

Friday Decr 25th 1835

First part of these 24 hours light winds and fine
weather middle and latter parts much the same steering
East By Compass so Enos Latd By Ob - 36.38 South
Long By Chron - 82.19 East

Saturday Decr 26th 1835

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S. West
middle and latter parts squally steering East By Compass
so Enos Latd - 35.33 South Long - 84.30 East

Sunday Decr 27th 1835

First part of these 24 hours squally weather took in top
Gallant sails and (Scrub) Reel the top sails middle
and latter parts much the same steering By the wind
heaving S. so Enos Latd 34.47 South Long - 86.38 East

Monday Decr 28th 1835

First part of these 24 hours more moderate winds still
from the northward steering by the wind middle and
latter parts much the same so Enos Latd - 32.49 South
Long By Chron - 91.49

Tuesday Decr 29th 1835

First part of these 24 hours light winds and fine
weather middle and latter parts much the same
steering S. East By Compass so Enos Latd - 30.28
Long By Chron - 94.17 East
