Thursday Decr 31st 1835

First part of these 24 hours strong S. East winds and clear weather steering N. N. East By compass middle and latter parts much the same so Enos
Lat By Obs - 24. 58 South Long 93. 02 East

Friday Jan 1st 1836

These 24 hours commences with light winds from the S. East and fine weather middle and latter parts much the same so Enos these 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 23. 32 South Long By Chron - 93. 47 East

Saturday Jan 2^d 1836

These 24 hours commences with light winds and fine weather with passing clouds middle and latter parts much the same so Enos
Lat 21. 36 South Long By Chron - 93. 37

Sunday Jan 3^d 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S. East By East with frequent squalls of rain steering N. E. By N. middle and latter parts much the same so Enos these 24 hours
Lat - 18. 57 Long By Chron - 94. 30 E.

Monday Jan 4th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds with frequent squalls of rain middle and latter parts light breeze and fine weather steering N. E. By N. so Enos these 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 17. 28 South Long By Chron - 95. 16 East

Tuesday Jan 5th 1836

Continues strong winds from the S. East and pleasant weather steering By the wind to the North ward and Eastward saw nothing remarkable middle and latter parts much the same so Enos
Lat By Obs - 14. 46 South Long By Chron - 96. 29 East

Wednesday Jan 6th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the East By South with frequent squalls of rain steering N. East. By N. middle and latter parts much the same so Enos these 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 12. 41 South Long By Chron - 97. 14 East

Thursday Jan 7th 1836

First part of these 24 hours squally weather at 2 P.M. made the Cocoa Islands bearing N. By East Dist 5 Leagues at 4 P.M. saw a ship lying off and on the Islands at 7 P.M. took in the top Gallies and supposed the wind heading N. E. by East at 7 A.M. lowered two Boats and went on shore after Cocoa nuts &c at 1/2 past 8 a Boat from the shore came off to the ship at 10 A.M. the Boats came on board with Cocoa nuts and sugar came &c so Enos

Friday Jan 8th 1836

First part of these 24 hours much the same as above at meridian the Capt and Boats crew went on shore after fowls &c ship lying off and on the Island middle and latter parts much the same so Enos

Saturday Jan 9th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds and clear weather at sunrise Boats came on board with the Captain at 9 A.M. two Boats went on shore again after Cocoa nuts and sugar came a Boat from the shore came off with fowls eggs turtle &c. at 4 P.M. Boats came on board and went on shore again after fowls &c at daylight came on board again ship lying off and on at 10 A.M. filled away steering N. N. West so Enos
