There 24 hours continues fine weather all hands
Employed in ships Duty steering N. East By
Compass Middle and latter Parts much
the same saw nothing Remarkable so Enos
Lat By Obs - 3. 18 North Long By Chron - 93. 08 East

Saturday Jan 23rd 1836

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from
the North and pleasant weather heading N. by E.
Middle and latter Parts strong breezes and
fine weather so Enos Lat By Obs - 3. 23 North
Long By Chron - 93. 55 E.

Sunday Jan 24th 1836

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the
North and pleasant weather at 4 P.M. tacked ship
and stood to the Eastward Middle and latter
Parts much the same so Enos there 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 3. 51 North Long By Chron - 94. 06 East

Monday Jan 25th 1836

First Part of these 24 hours light winds from the
North tacked ship and stood to the N. West Middle
and latter Parts strong winds from the North at
day light tacked ship again so Enos there 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 4. 21 North Long By Chron - 95. 20 East

Tuesday Jan 26th 1836

First Part of these 24 hours strong winds from
the North steering N. East all hands Employed
in repairing sails and on ships Duty Middle
Parts light winds from the East steering N. N. West
By compass at day light made the Island of
Sumatra bearing E. N. East (Dist 8 Leagues
latter Parts strong winds from the E. N. East and
fine weather so Enos there 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 5. 41 North Long By Chron - 94. 42

Wednesday Jan 27th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the
E. N. East and pleasant weather steering N. N. West
By compass and green water sounded found no
Bottom Middle and latter Parts much the same
at 10 P.M. made the Nicholai Islands so Enos
there 24 hours Lat By Obs - 7. 01 North Long - 95. 38 East

Thursday Jan 28th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong from the N. East
and fine weather steering by the wind heading
N. N. West Middle and latter Parts much the same
at daylight saw the Island of catchall so Enos
Lat By Obs - 9. 06 North Long By Chron - 92. 47 East

Friday Jan 29th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the N. E.
steering N. N. West and pleasant weather at 4 P.M. saw
a school of Black fish (Dawn Boats Starboard and
larboard struck Irons (Dawned came on Board and
shortened sail Middle and latter Parts much the same
at 12 P.M. tacked ship and at 4 P.M. tacked ship
again so Enos Lat By Obs - 9. 42 North Long - 92. 45 East

Saturday Jan 30th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the
N. East and fine weather Middle and latter Parts
much the same so Enos there 24 hours Lat - 9. 38 North
Long - 92. 52 East

Sunday Jan 31st 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds and pleasant
weather at 2 P.M. saw the Island Car Nicholai
bearing S. S. West (Dist 8 Leagues Middle and latter
much the same so Enos Lat By Obs - 9. 30 North
Long By Chron - 92. 57 East
