

Monday Feb. 1st 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the N. East and pleasant weather at 7 A.M. ran off before the wind at 6 P.M. Gazed to the wind and took in sail Middle Part much the same Latter Part Light winds at 9 A.M. saw the Island of Batty Molly in Green Lat By Ob - 9. 18 North Long By Obs - 93. 00 East

Tuesday Feb. 2^d 1836

First part of these 24 hours Light winds from the N.E. and pleasant weather at 8 P.M. saw the Island of Cor Nicolai Middle Part Light winds and fine weather at 10 P.M. went on Board of a Brig that lay at anchor at mercurian came on Board at 1 P.M. went on shore to trade with the natives at sunset came on Board with Oranges Lemons Limes Yams Coconuts Bananas &c. Latter Part fine weather so Green Lat - 9. 23 North Long - 92. 50 East

Wednesday Feb. 3^d 1836

First part of these 24 hours Light winds and fine weather Middle Part much the same at 6 A.M. the Boats went on shore again after Fruit &c. Latter Part the same so Green Lat By Ob - 9. 20 N. Long By Obs - 92. 48

Thursday Feb. 4th 1836

First part of these 24 hours Light winds and pleasant weather at mercurian the Boats came off and returned again to the shore at 4 P.M. the Boats and Capt. came on Board with Fruit &c. Ship on the wind heading to the North and West a heavy squall at the windward so Green there 24 hours Lat By Ob - 9. 29 North Long By Obs - 92. 50 East

Friday Feb. 5th 1836

First part of these 24 hours Light winds from the N. East and pleasant weather at 1 P.M. saw a school of sperm whales (Down Boats starboard Larboard and Middle Boats each struck and killed a whale and took them along side and cut one in took in sail and set the watch Boats crews Middle and Latter parts much the same at 6 A.M. commenced cutting in the two whales that lay along side at 9 A.M. finished cutting and made sail so Green Lat - 9. 28 N. Long By Obs - 92. 52 East



Saturday Feb. 6th 1836

First part of these 24 hours Light winds and pleasant weather commenced Boiling at sunset took in sail heading off shore Lane in sight Middle and Latter Parts much the same at 9 A.M. saw Blackfish (Down Boats did not fasten so Green there 24 hours Lat By Ob - 9. 11 North Long By Obs - 91. 55 East

Sunday Feb. 7th 1836

First part strong winds from the N. East and pleasant weather at 8 P.M. finished Boiling and set the watch Boats crews Middle Parts Light winds Latter Parts strong winds and nothing so Green Lat - 9. 58 North Long - 9. 50 East

Monday Feb. 8th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds and pleasant weather steering South West Middle and Latter Parts much the same at sunrise commenced stowing Down oil so Green Lat By Ob - 9. 43 North Long - 91. 30 E.

Tuesday Feb. 9th 1836

First part of these 24 hours Light winds from the N. East and pleasant weather at 4 P.M. finished stowing down oil Middle and Latter Parts much the same so Green there 24 hours Lat By Ob - 91. 55 N. Long By Obs - 91. 41 East
