First part of these 24 hours light from the N.E. and pleasant weather the watch employed in setting up rigging and ships duty Middle and latter parts much the same so ends Date - 10. 55 North Long By Chron - 91. 00 East

Thursday Feb^y 11th 1836

First part of these 24 hours light winds from N.E. and pleasant weather saw whale spouts to be humpback whale Middle and latter parts much the same so ends these 24 hours Date by Chron - 10. 17 North Long By Chron - 91. 13 East

Friday Feb^y 12th 1836

Continued fine pleasant weather the first part saw Brecker supposed to be Grampases Middle and latter parts much the same so ends these 24 hours Date by Chron - 9. 35 North Long - 92. 05 East

Saturday Feb^y 13th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the East and pleasant weather saw nothing remarkable Middle and latter parts much the same so ends Date - by Chron - 10. 51 North Long - 92. 20 East

Sunday Feb^y 14th 1836

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the East and pleasant weather at 3 P.M. one of the Andaman Islands bearing N. by East Six to 6 Leagues Middle and latter parts much the same saw hump backs so ends these 24 hours Date by Chron - 10. 17 North Long By Chron - 92. 45 East

Monday Feb^y 15th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the East and pleasant weather saw the Island called the North centinel and great Andaman at 4 P.M. shortened sail heading south Middle and latter parts much the same so ends Date - 11. 00 North Long - 92. 44 East

Tuesday Feb^y 16th 1836

First part strong Breeze from the East with fine weather saw Black fish Down Boat and took 3 of them Middle and latter parts much the same so ends these 24 hours Date by Chron - 10. 45 North Long By Chron - 92. 46 East

Wednesday Feb^y 17th 1836

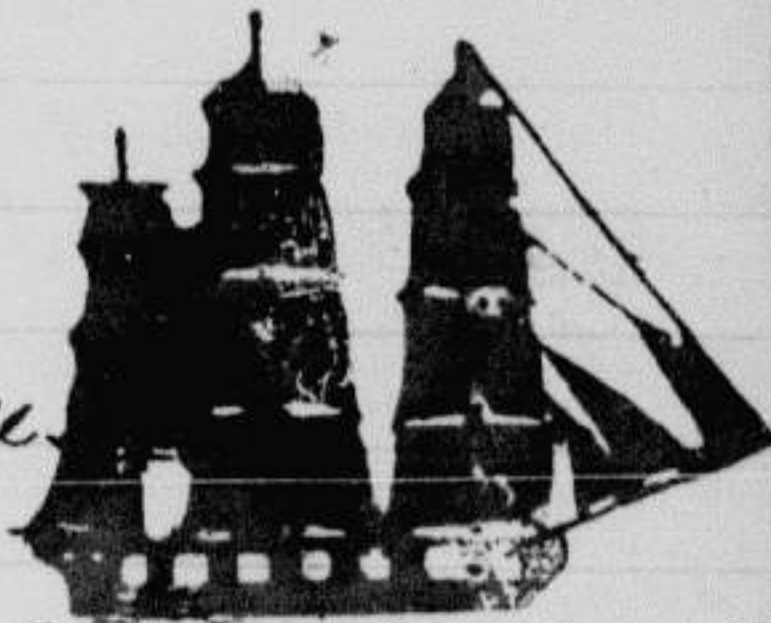
First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the East and pleasant weather middle parts light winds latter parts strong winds all hands employed in Bailing out the Black fish so ends Date by Chron - 10. 28 N. Long - 92. 50 East

Thursday Feb^y 18th 1836

First part strong winds from the N.E. and fine weather saw the Island Car Nicobar Middle and latter parts much the same at 9 A.M. saw a ship lying at anchor at Car Nicobar so ends Date by Chron - 9. 26 North Long By Chron - 93. 10 East

Friday Feb^y 19th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds and fine weather at 1 P.M. saw Black fish Down Boat got two of them Middle and latter parts much the same at 9 A.M. saw a ship at 10 A.M. spoke her, Bark Russell of New Bedford Capt. Gifford with 1200 lbs of spermac Oil so ends these 24 hours Date - 9. 26 N. Long - 92. 40 East



Saturday Feb^y 20th 1836

First part strong winds from the N.E. and pleasant weather Capt. Gifford on Board of us Middle parts light winds from the N.E. latter parts strong winds steering S.E. West so ends Date 9. 34 North Long By Chron - 91. 52 East

Sunday Feb^y 21st 1836

These 24 hours commences with strong winds and pleasant weather steering S.E. East at sun down shortened sail and heaved to the wind Middle part light winds latter part strong strong winds saw nothing remarkable so ends Date - 8. 28 North Long - 92. 15 East
