

Monday Feb 22nd 1836

Continues strong breezes and pleasant Middle
and Latter Parts much the same At 1/2 Past 11 A.M.
saw the Island of Batty Molly so Bore there 24 hours
Latitude By Obs - 8. 40 North Long - 93. 13 East

Tuesday Feb 23rd 1836

Continues strong winds from the N. East with
pleasant weather saw Nothing Remarkable Middle
and Latter Parts much the same At 10 A.M. send
a ship steering to the Southward supposed to be
the Barque Russell of New Bedford so Bore
Latitude By Obs - 8. 48 North Long By Chron - 92. 53 East

Wednesday Feb 24th 1836

First part Light winds from the N. East with
pleasant weather At 2 P.M. the Capt and Boats
crew went on shore at Nichobar in Pursuit of water
At 7 A.M. the Capt and Boats crew went on shore
again at merican came on board so Bore
Latitude - 9. 10 North Long By Chron - 92. 58 East

Thursday Feb 25th 1836

All these 24 hours Light winds and pleasant weather
at 4 P.M. came to anchor on the West side of
Bar Nichobar Middle and Latter Parts much
the same At 1/2 Past 8 A.M. went on shore with
13 casks for water so Bore there 24 hours Latitude 9. 10 N.
Long - 92. 56 East

Friday Feb 26th 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds and
pleasant weather at 4 P.M. came off with the water
and hoisted it on Board the Capt and Boats crew
went on shore and got a load of Cocoa nuts &c Middle
and Latter parts much the same so Bore
Latitude By Obs - 9. 15 North Long - 92. 56 North

Saturday Feb 27th 1836

Continues strong winds and pleasant weather at
11 A.M. sent two Boats on shore after recruits at
5 P.M. came on Board with yams Cocoa nuts &c
stowed the anchor unhooked the chain &c Middle
and Latter Parts much the same so Bore there 24 hours
Latitude By Obs - 9. 44 North Long By Chron - 93. 32 East

Sunday Feb 28th 1836

These 24 hours commences with Light winds from
the N. and pleasant weather Middle and Latter
Parts much the same so Bore Latitude - 9. 24 North
Long - 94. 40 East

Monday Feb 29th 1836

Continues Light winds from the North with pleasant
weather Middle Parts much the same Latter Parts
strong winds from the N. East and pleasant weather
saw nothing but porpoises caught one so Bore
Latitude By Obs - 9. 14 North Long By Chron - 96. 10 East

Tuesday March 1st 1836

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the
N. East and clear weather saw Breaches did not
ascertain what kind of fish they were Middle and
Latter Parts much the same so Bore Latitude - 9. 47 North
Long - 96. 38 East

Wednesday March 2nd 1836

All these 24 hours Light winds from the N. East
with fine weather at 8 A.M. saw a ship steering
to the Eastward with all sail set so Bore
Latitude By Obs - 8. 00 North Long By Chron - 96. 24 East

Thursday March 3rd 1836

Continues Light winds from the North with Remarka-
ble good weather a ship to the windward about
3 Leagues Dist Middle and Latter Parts much the
same saw Black fish Down Boat did not get
fast caught a porpoise so Bore Latitude - 8. 59 North
Long - 97. 37 East
