

Friday March 4th 1836

Continues Light winds and fine weather
at 3 P.M. saw a ship to the windward of us
steering to the Eastward at 5 P.M. made the
Sleight of Sire Bearing S. East. Dist. 8 Leagues
middle and latter parts much the same at 10
A.M. saw a Brig steering by the wind so Enes
Lats by Obs - 8.48 North Long - 97.48 East

Saturday March 5th 1836

First part of these 24 hours Light winds and
fine weather Middle Part frequent squalls
of Rain latter parts much the same so Enes
Lats - 8.40 North Long by Obs - 97.54 East

Sunday March 6th 1836

Continues Light winds and fine weather saw
nothing but a fin back whale Middle and
latter parts frequent squalls of Rain so Enes
Lats by Obs - 7.52 North Long by Obs - 97.24 East

Monday March 7th 1836

These 24 hours commences with strong winds and
pleasant weather at 2 P.M. saw a school
of sperm whales down Boat all three of
them got back the 2 whales a piece and
saw one a piece and took them along
side and set the watch Boat crew
Middle and latter parts strong winds
attended with a little Rain at Daylight commen-
ced cutting at 10 A.M. finished and commenced
Boiling so Enes House Lats - 8.07 North Long - 97.21 East



Tuesday March 8th 1836

First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze and fine
weather Middle parts much the same at 7 A.M.
saw a dead whale hoared a Boat and took him
along side and cut him in all hands Employed
in Boiling so Enes House Lats - 8.17 North Long 97.31 East



Wednesday March 9th 1836

First part of these 24 hours Calm with fine weather
all hands Employed in Boiling so Middle and
latter parts much the same at 5 P.M. finished
Boiling so Enes Lats by Obs - 8.00 North
Long by Obs - 97.28 East

Thursday March 10th 1836

First part of these 24 hours Calm weather saw Gramp²³
H.C. Middle and latter parts Light Breeze saw nothing
Remarkable so Enes Lats by Obs - 7.30 North
Long - 97.15 East

Friday March 11th 1836

Continues Light winds and fine weather saw
Black fish Middle and latter parts much the same
at sunrise commenced stowing Down oil so Enes
Lats by Obs - 7.25 North Long - 97.06 East

Saturday March 12th 1836

Continues Light winds and fine weather saw Black
fish at 4 P.M. finished stowing Down oil Middle
and latter parts much the same steering West S.
West so Enes Lats by Obs - 7.28 North Long 96.40 East

Sunday March 13th 1836

Continues much the same as above saw nothing
Remarkable steering West S. West Middle parts
Calm so Enes Lats - 7.52 North Long - 97.23 East

Monday March 14th 1836

First part of these 24 hours calm saw Black fish
Down Boat and got 2 of them Middle and
latter parts Light winds saw Black fish again
Down Boat and got one of them so Enes these 24 hours
Lats by Obs - 7.57 North Long by Obs - 96.24 East

Tuesday March 15th 1836

Continues Light winds and fine weather Middle
and latter parts much the same so Enes these 24 hours
Lats by Obs - 7.53 North Long by Obs - 96.26 East
