

Monday March 28th 1836

First part strong winds with frequent squalls of Rain steering S. S. East Middle and Latter parts much the same Saw hump Back whales so Enes there 24 hours Lat By Obs - 51 North
Long By Chron - 22. 40 East

Tuesday March 29th 1836

First part of there 24 hours light winds from the North and East and cloudy weather steering South. E. By compass Middle parts much the same Latter parts calm at 10 A.M. saw sperm whales Down Boats all three Boats struck killed and took them along side so Enes there 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 4. 57 North Long By Chron - 93. 20 East



Wednesday March 30th 1836

Continues calm and good weather at 2 P.M. commenced cutting at 5 P.M. finished at sun set took in sail and set the watch Boats crew Middle and Latter parts much the same at 8 A.M. saw a dead whale loared a Boat and took him along side and cut him in and commenced boiling so Enes there 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 4. 53 North Long By Chron - 93. 31 East

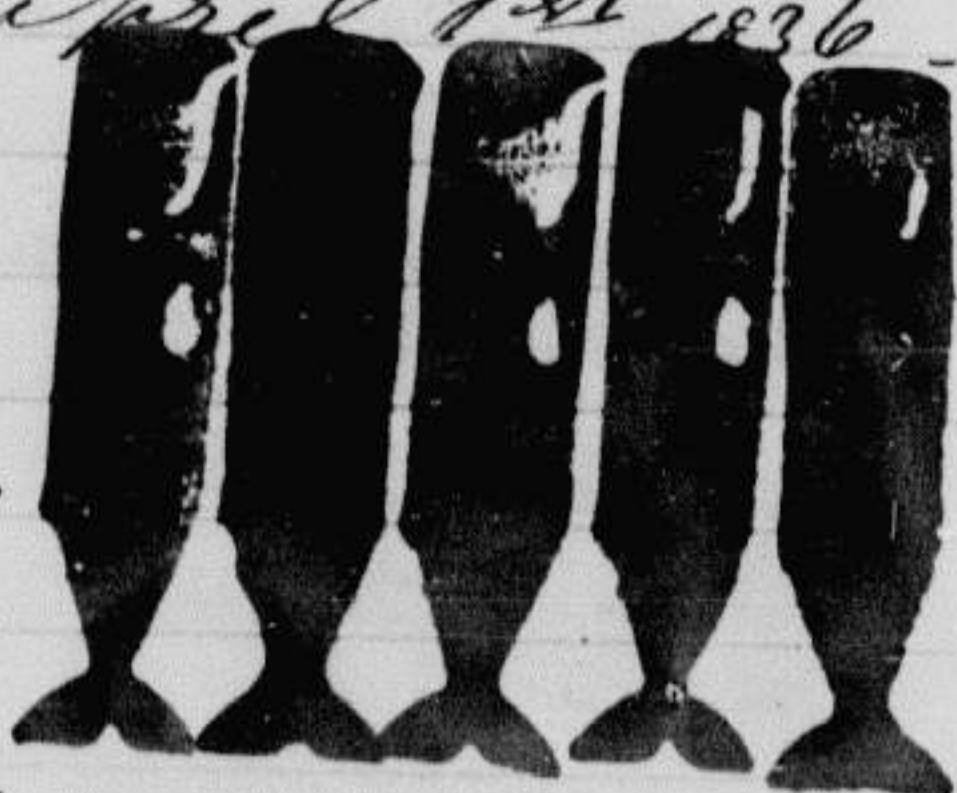


Thursday March 31st 1836

Continues calm the first part with very warm weather Saw Grampas Middle and Latter parts much the same all hands Employed in Boiling so Enes Lat - 4. 55 North Long - 93. 40 East

Friday April 1st 1836

Continues calm at Meridian saw sperm whales Down Boats all three Boats struck and killed 5 whales and took them along side and cut 3 of them in at 7 A.M. hooked on to the other whales and cut them in and continued boiling so Enes Lat - 4. 57 North
Long - 93. 47 East



Saturday April 2^d 1836

Continues calm all hands Employed in clearing away the heads &c Middle and Latter cloudy with frequent squalls of Rain all hands Employed in Boiling so Enes there 24 hours Lat - 4. 48 North
Long - 93. 51 East

Sunday April 3^d 1836

Continues light winds with frequent squalls of Rain all hands Employed in Boiling &c at 4 P.M. finished Boiling and cleared up Decks and set the Middle and Latter Parts much the same at 7 A.M. commenced stowing Down Oil so Enes Lat - 4. 50 North
Long By Chron - 93. 57 East

Monday April 4th 1836

First part of there 24 hours light winds from the East with squalls of Rain still stowing down oil Middle and Latter parts light breezes and fine weather so Enes there 24 hours Lat - 4. 53 N. Long - 94. 05

Tuesday April 5th 1836

Continues light winds and pleasant weather all hands Employed in stowing Down Oil Middle and Latter parts much the same at 11 A.M. finished stowing Down Oil so Enes Lat By Obs - 4. 45 North
Long By Chron - 94. 08 East

Wednesday April 6th 1836

Continues light winds from the south with pleasant weather steering By the wind heading to the East ward Middle and Latter part much the same steering South so Enes Lat By Obs - 4. 20 North
Long By Chron - 94. 12 East

Thursday April 7th 1836

Continues light winds from the S. and East and fine weather steering South Middle and Latter parts much the same so Enes there 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 3. 39 North Long By Chron - 94. 26 East
