Continues much the same as above Capt and Boats crew on Board the *Stephania*, Steering by the wind to the S. and East Middle and Tatter Parts much the same at 11 a.m. saw a large sperm whale so Enos there 24 hours

Monday May 16th 1836

Continues strong winds from the South and East at 2 P.M. Down Boats and struck and killed a large sperm whale and took him along side and set the watch Middle and Tatter Parts much the same at 6 a.m. commenced cutting so Enos Lat -

Tuesday May 17th 1836

There 24 hours commences with strong S. East winds and pleasant weather Middle and Tatter parts much the same at 1 P.M. commenced Boiling so Enos there 24 hours Lat By Obs -

Wednesday May 18th 1836

Commences more moderate with fine weather all hands Employed in cutting up Junk and Boiling Middle and Tatter Parts strong winds and clear weather all hands Employed in Boiling so Enos Lat By Obs -

Thursday May 19th 1836

Commences more moderate with a heavy sea running all hands Employed in Boiling Middle and Tatter Parts much the same at Day Light finished Boiling and commenced stowing Down oil so Enos there 24 hours

Friday May 20th 1836

Continues moderate still breaking out and stowing Down oil Middle and Tatter Parts much the same so Enos there 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 25. 17 South Long By Obs - 110. 18 East

Saturday May 21st 1836

Continues light winds from the South and East with pleasant weather at 6 P.M. finished stowing Down Oil Middle ~~Parts~~ and Tatter Parts much at 7 a.m. saw a large sperm whale Down Boats Starboard Boat struck killed and took him along side and commenced cutting him in so Enos there 24 hours Lat By Obs -

Sunday May 22nd 1836

Continues much the same as above at 1/2 Past 5 finished cutting and commenced Boiling Middle and Tatter parts much the same so Enos Lat -

Monday May 23rd 1836

Continues much the same as above at 2 P.M. saw a school of sperm whales Down Boats Starboard Boat struck killed and took him along side Middle and Tatter parts much the same at 8 a.m. commenced cutting at 1/2 Past 10 finished so Enos Lat By Obs - 25. 02 South Long - 110. 48 East

Tuesday May 24th 1836

Commences strong winds and rugged weather all hands Employed in Boiling and setting up 3 hooks Middle and Tatter parts much the same all hands Employed in stowing Down Oil so Enos Lat -

Wednesday May 25th 1836

Continues much the same as above winds from the South all hands Employed in Boiling and stowing Down Oil at 10 P.M. finished Boiling Middle and Tatter Parts more moderate so Enos Lat -
