

Thursday May 26th 1836

Continues Light winds, and good weather all hands Employed in stowing Down Oil Middle and Latter Parts calm at meridian finished stowing Down Oil so Enos Latd -- 24. 53 South Long -- 110. 35 East

Friday May 27th 1836

Commences Light winds from the South with good weather Middle and Latter parts much the same so Enos Latd -- 24. 46 South

Long By Chro -- 110. 43 East

Saturday May 28th 1836

Commences with Light winds from the South and West with fine weather Saw humpbacks Middle and Latter Parts frequent squalls of rain so Enos Latd By Obs -- 25. 23 South Long -- 111. 43 East

Sunday May 29th 1836

Continues much the same as above steering to the Eastward Middle Parts much the same Latter Parts strong winds, and cloudy weather so Enos Latd By Obs -- Long --

Monday May 30th 1836

Commences fresh gales from the south and clear weather Middle and Latter Parts much the same with a heavy sea running Saw hump backs so Enos Latd By Obs -- 25. 17 South Long By Chro -- 112. 11 East

Tuesday May 31st 1836

Continues much the same as above steering by the wind to the East Under Double Reefed top sails Middle and Latter Parts much the same so Enos Latd By Obs -- 25. 07 South Long By Chro -- 112. 43 East

Wednesday June 1st 1836

Commences more moderate with Pleasant weather steering By the wind to the East at 2 P.M. sounded But found no Bottom at 5 P.M. sounded again found no Bottom Middle Parts much the same Latter parts Calm Saw humpbacks so Enos Latd By Obs -- 24. 14 South Long By Chro -- 110. 08 East

Thursday June 2^d 1836

First part of these 24 hours calm with fine weather all hands Employed in ships Duty Middle and Latter parts fresh Breezes and fine weather steering West, S, West By compass so Enos Latd, 24. 38 South Long By Chro -- 111. 55 East

Friday June 3^d 1836

Continues fresh Breezes from the South East and pleasant weather steering S.W. by West By compass Saw fin Backs; this day commenced wetting hold Middle parts much the same Latter parts strong winds so Enos Latd By Obs -- 25. 11 South Long By Chro -- 111. 22 East

Saturday June 4th 1836

Continues much the same as above steering South West By West By compass Saw fin Backs Middle and Latter Parts much the same so Enos Latd By Obs -- 25. 24 South Long By Chro -- 110. 44 East

Sunday June 5th 1836

Continues strong winds from the S. East and blazy weather steering S. West By West By compass Saw fin Backs Middle and Latter parts much the same so Enos Latd -- 25. 53 South Long -- 110. 14 E.

Monday June 6th 1836

Commences more moderate with cloudy weather steering By the wind to the S. and W. At 5 P.M. saw a large sperm whale did not lower in being sunset before we came up with Middle and Latter parts frequent squalls of rain so Enos -- Latd -- 25. 28 South Long -- 110. 00 East
