Sunday July 10th 1836

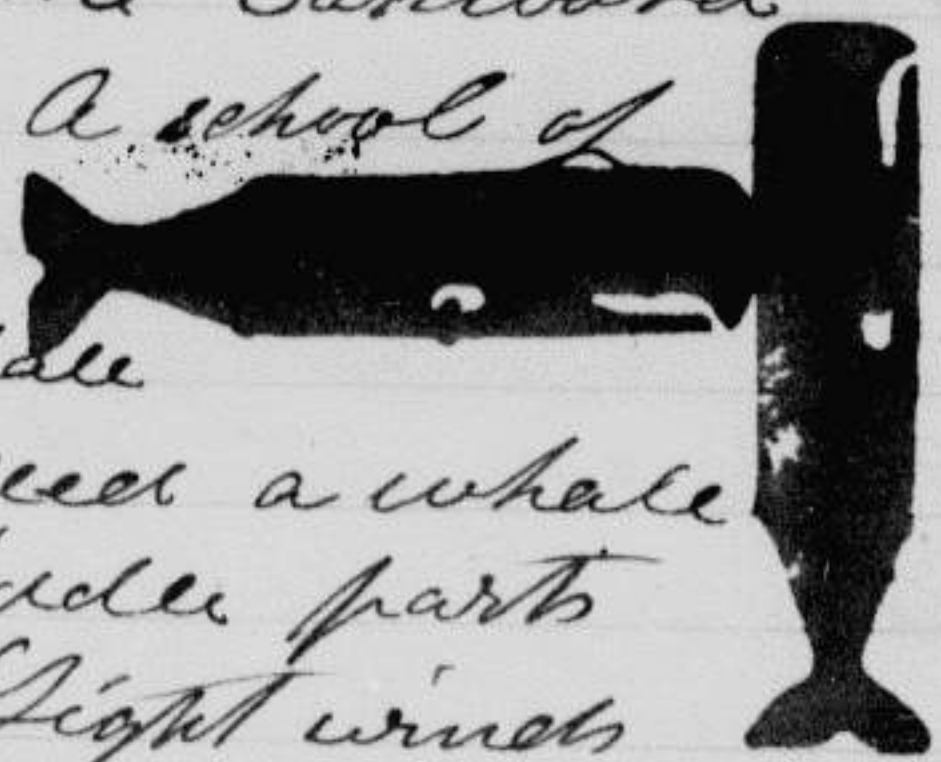
Continues strong winds and cloudy weather with a heavy swell steering to the S. and East by the wind Middle and latter parts more moderate with fine weather so Ends these 24 hours Lat By Ob- 17. 33 South Long By Ob- 114. 26 East

Monday July 11th 1836

Continues light winds from the East with fine weather steering to the S. and East by the wind Middle and latter parts much the same so Ends Lat By Ob- 17. 15 South Long By Ob- 114. 32 East

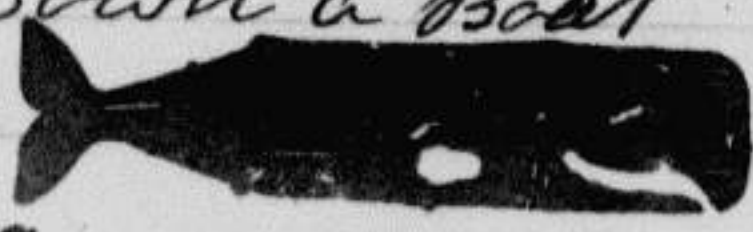
Tuesday July 12th 1836

Commences strong winds from the Eastward steering to the S. and East saw a school of sperm whales (Down Boat star-board Boat struck and killed a whale the waiste Boat struck and killed a whale and took them along side Middle parts much the same latter parts light winds and fine weather at Daylight commenced cutting in the whales at 4th part to a.m. finished so Ends Lat By Ob- 17. 06 South Long By Ob- 114. 33 East



Wednesday July 13th 1836

Continues light winds and fine weather at 1 P.M. saw a large waisted whale Down a Boat and took him along side and cut him in once set the watch Middle parts strong winds at 10 P.M. commenced Boiling latter part light winds all hands employed in Boiling so Ends these 24 hours Lat By Ob- 17. 14 South Long



Thursday July 14th 1836

Continues light winds and fine weather all hands employed in Boiling Middle parts much the same latter parts strong winds from the East ward and good weather so Ends Lat By Ob- 17. 30 South Long By Ob-

Friday July 15th 1836

Continues strong winds and clear weather all hands employed in Boiling at 10 P.M. cooled Down Middle and latter parts much the same at Daylight commenced stowing Down Oil so Ends these 24 hours Lat By Ob- 17. 41 South Long By Ob-

Saturday July 16th 1836

Continues strong winds and rugged weather all hands employed in stowing Down Oil Middle and latter parts more moderate with a very heavy swell so Ends Lat By Ob- 17. 45 South Long

Sunday July 17th 1836

Continues strong winds from the south and East with pleasant weather at 5 P.M. finished stowing Down Oil Middle and latter parts much the same steering by the wind to the South and East so Ends Lat By Ob- Long--

Monday July 18th 1836

Commences light winds and fine weather steering to the South and East by the wind saw nothing remarkable Middle and latter parts much the same so Ends Lat By Ob- 18. 04 South Long -- 115. 25 East

Tuesday July 19th 1836

Continues light winds from the West and fine weather steering East by S Middle and latter parts much the same steering to the Eastward by the wind so Ends Lat By Ob- 18. 10 South Long By Ob- 116. 43 East
