Continues Light winds and fine weather all hands Employed in Cutting Up junk &c-

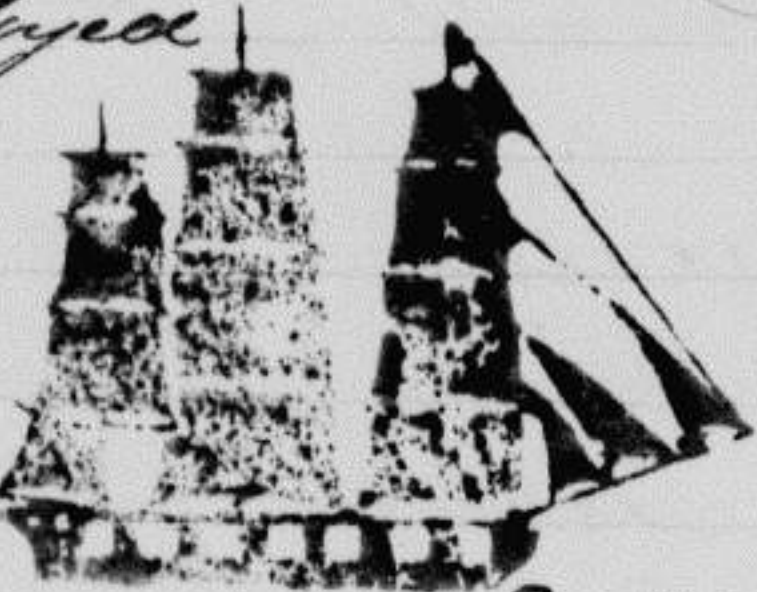


Middle and Latter parts much the same at 8, a.m. Saw a Large sperm whale Down Boats Garboard Boat struck killed and took him along side -- Still a boiling 20 Enos these 24 hours

Monday August 1st 1836

Continues Light winds and fine weather at 5 P.M. the Ship Russell again all hands Employed in Boiling Middle Parts Strong Breezes



at 7 a.m. commenced cutting Latter Parts much the same Saw the Ship Russell steering to the Eastward so Enos

Tuesday August 2^d 1836

Continues Light winds and fine weather all hands Employed in cutting at 4 P.M. finished cutting and commenced Boiling again Middle and Latter parts strong winds and pleasant weather all hands Employed in Boiling so Enos

Lats - 17. 31 South Long By Ob - 115. 40 East

Wednesday August 3^d 1836

Continues strong winds and pleasant weather all hands Employed in Boiling Middle and Latter Parts much the same so Enos

Lats By Ob - 17. 25 South Long By Ob - 115. 11 East

Thursday August 4th 1836

Continues much the same as above at 7 P.M. finished Boiling Middle and Latter parts much the same all hands Employed in stowing Down Oil so Enos

Lats 17. 40 South Long

Friday August 5th 1836

Continues strong winds from the East with Pleasant weather all hands Employed in stowing Down Oil Middle and Latter Parts much the same so Enos these 24 hours

Lats - 17. 15 South Long - 115. 19 East

Saturday August 6th 1836

Continues strong winds and pleasant weather all hands Employed in stowing Down Oil Middle and Latter parts much the same at 11, a.m. saw a ship all hands Employed in stowing Between Decks so Enos

Lats - 17. 48 South Long - 115. 30 East

Sunday August 7th 1836

Continues strong winds from the East with pleasant weather all hands Employed in setting up Piped Middle and Latter parts much the same so Enos

Lats By Ob - 17. 42 South Long - By D. R.

Monday August 8th 1836

Continues strong winds from the East with Pleasant weather steering By the wind to the south and West Middle and Latter Parts much the same so Enos these 24 hours

Lats By Ob - 18. 00 South Long

Tuesday August 9th 1836

Continues strong winds from the East with Pleasant weather Middle and Latter Parts much the same steering to the South and East so Enos these 24 hours

Lats By Ob - 18. 26 South Long

Wednesday August 10th 1836

Commences Light winds and fine weather at 5 P.M. saw a ship to the seaward Middle and Latter Parts much the same so Enos these 24 hours

Lats By Ob - 18. 58 South Long By Ob
