Recruits on Board so ends these 24 hours - - -

Tuesday Sept 20th 1836

All these 24 hours Light winds and Pleasant
weather at 4 P.M. weighed our anchor and
sailed from the harbour of Soutauea so ends -

Wednesday Sept 21st 1836

First and middle parts strong winds and
pleasant weather Latter Parts Light winds and
fine weather so ends these 24 hours -

Thursday Sept 22^d 1836

Commenced strong Breezes from the S. East and
good weather at sun set shortened sail and stowed
Boats crews Latter parts good weather all hands
Employed in Ships Duty so ends these 24 hours
Lat By Obs - - Long By Chron - -

Friday Sept 23^d 1836

These 24 hours commenced with Gentle Breezes from
the S. East and pleasant weather Middle and Latter
parts much the same so ends - Lat - -
Long - -

Saturday Sept 24th 1836

Continued pleasant Breezes from the S. E. and
pleasant weather at 7 P.M. Shortened sail and
stowed & went By the wind Middle and Latter
parts much the same so ends Lat - -
Long - -

Sunday Sept 25th 1836

Continued Gentle Breezes from the S. E. and
fine weather steering By the wind to the S. W.
Middle part strong winds Latter part Light
winds and fine weather At 10 A.M. saw
a school of sperm whales so ends Lat - 12. 18 South
Long By Chron - 120. 45 East

Monday Sept 26th 1836

Commenced Light winds and fine weather at
1 P.M. Down Boats Starboard Larboard and Waite
Boats Struck and killed 3 whales took
2 of them along side and set the watch
quarter watch Middle and Latter
parts much the same At 6 A.M. Commenced
cutting in the whales that Lay along side at 9
A.M. finished cutting and commenced Boiling
so ends Lat - 12. 35 South Long By (D. R.) - 120. 12 East

Tuesday Sept 27th 1836

Continued Light winds and fine weather all
hands Employed in Boiling Middle and Latter
parts much the same at 10 A.M. Cooked
down the works so ends Lat By Obs - 12. 13 South
Long By Chron - 120. 42 East

Wednesday Sept 28th 1836

Commenced calm and pleasant weather all hands
Employed in Coopering Oil &c Middle and Latter
parts much the same saw Grampasses so ends -
Lat By Obs - 13. 20 South Long By (D. R.) - 120. 02 East

Thursday Sept 29th 1836

Continued Calm first part of these 24 hours the
watch Employed in fitting the Outer Bob stays
Middle part much the same At 7 A.M.
commenced stowing down Oil Latter parts Light
winds so ends Lat By Obs - 13. 51 South Long - 120. 50 E.

Friday Sept 30th 1836

Continued Light winds and pleasant weather
At 2 P.M. finished stowing down Oil All hands
Employed in ship Duty Middle and Latter
parts much the same so ends these 24 hours
Lat By Obs - 14. 12 South Long - 120. 45 East
