Friday Oct 7th 1836

good weather steering West all hands Employed
in repairing sails &c. Middle and Latter
parts Light winds and fine weather so ends

Saturday Oct 8th 1836

All these 24 hours pleasant gales and good
Saw two ships steering S West saw hump Backs
so ends these 24 hours Lat-- Long--

Sunday Oct 9th 1836

All these 24 hours gentle Breezes and fine
weather Saw a number of hump Back whales
and Black fish steering S West By the wind all
hands Employed in Repairing sails so ends
Lat-- Long--

Monday Oct 10th 1836

All these 24 hours pleasant Breezes and fine
weather steering S West By the wind Saw Black
fish so ends these 24 hours Lat-- Long--

Tuesday Oct 11th 1836

All these 24 hours pleasant gales and fine weather
Saw a ship apparently a whaler steering to the East-
ward at sunset shortened sail so ends these 24 hours
Lat By Obs. Long By Chron.

Wednesday Oct 12th 1836

Continued pleasant Breezes and fine weather Middle
and Latter parts much the same All hands
Employed in ships Duty so ends Lat-- Long--

to be whalers Middle and Latter parts much the same
