

Friday Oct- 14th 1836

All these 24 hours strong breezes from the West and pleasant weather steering to the Southward Untent the jib and bent another one so ends
Lats By Obs. Long.

Saturday Oct- 15th 1836

Commenced strong winds and fine weather Saw a fin Back whale Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends these 24 hours
Lats By Obs. Long.

Sunday Oct- 16th 1836

Commenced Light winds and pleasant weather winds from the S. East Saw a ^{led} number of Black fish Middle and Latter parts much the same Steering West with all sail set so ends Lats. Long.

Monday Oct- 17th 1836

All these 24 hours Light winds from the S. East and fine pleasant weather steering West with all sail set so ends these 24 hours Lats. Long.

Tuesday Oct- 18th 1836

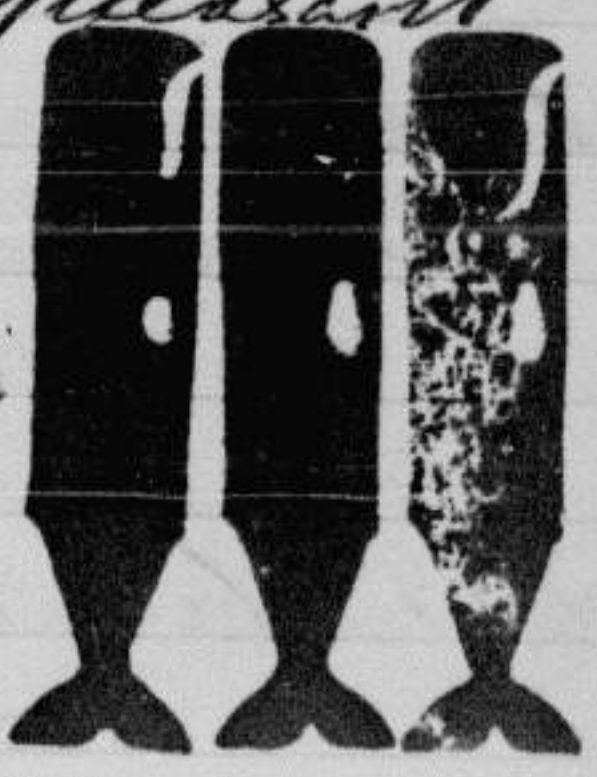
Continues Light winds and fine weather Steering to the westward with all sail set saw nothing remarkable so ends Lats- 15. 43 South Long- 117. 46 East

Wednesday Oct 19th 1836

Still continues Light winds and pleasant weather the first part steering to the westward Middle and Latter parts much the same at 10 A.M. Saw a school of sperm whales at 11 A.M. Down Boats and pursued so ends these 24 hours
Lats By Obs. 15. 52 South Long- 117. 10 East

Thursday Oct- 20th 1836

Continues Very Light winds and pleasant weather at meridian all three ^{boats} each struck and killed a whale and took them along side cut one in and set the watch at 6 A.M. worked on to the other whales and cut them in and commenced Bailing so ends these 24 hours Lats By Obs. 15. 58 South Long- 117. 08 East.



Friday Oct- 21st 1836

Continues Light winds and warm weather Saw Grampases Middle parts much the same Latter parts strong Breezes All hands employed in Bailing so ends Lats By. Long.

Saturday Oct- 22^d 1836

Continues strong winds from the south and pleasant weather with a heavy sea at 5 P.M. finished Bailing at sunset shortened sail Middle parts much the same Latter parts strong winds with a heavy sea running Ship Lying to Under Bury sail heading to the Westward so ends Lats By Obs. 16. 11 South Long.

Sunday Oct- 23^d 1836

Continues strong winds and pleasant weather with a heavy sea Ship Lying to Under main top sail and fore sail heading to the westward Middle and Latter parts much the same at 7 A.M. Saw a school of sperm whales (Did not lower for them so ends Lats. Long.

Monday Oct- 24th 1836

Continues strong winds from the S. and East with fine weather at 1 P.M. Commenced stowing down all at 6 P.M. finished Ship Lying to Under Close keeled main top sail and fore sail middle and Latter parts much the same so ends Lats. Long.
