Continues Light winds and pleasant weather  
Steering N. E. by Compass with all sail set Middle  
and Latter parts much the same so ends these 24 hours  
Lat's By Obs - 14. 45 South Long -

Thursday Nov 10<sup>th</sup> 1836  
Continues Light winds and pleasant weather  
steering N. E. at 6 A.M. commenced stowing  
down Oil at 11, finished Middle and Latter  
parts much the same so ends these 24 hours  
Lat's By Obs - 13. 30 South Long - 119. 39 East

Friday Nov 11<sup>th</sup> 1836  
Continues Light winds and fine weather steering  
N. E. saw humpbacks Middle parts much the  
same Latter parts Calm so ends Lat's - 13. 04 South  
Long - 119. 58 East

Saturday Nov 12<sup>th</sup> 1836  
These 24 hours <sup>commenced</sup> with Light winds from the westward  
and fine weather steering by the wind to the  
North Middle and Latter parts much the  
same so ends these 24 hours Lat's - 12. 33 South  
Long - 120. 00 East

Sunday Nov 13<sup>th</sup> 1836  
Commences Calm warm and pleasant weather  
Middle and Latter parts much the same  
so ends these 24 hours Lat's - 12. 20 South  
Long -

Monday Nov 14<sup>th</sup> 1836  
All these 24 hours much the same as above all  
hands Employed in Ships Duty so ends  
Lat's By Obs - 11. 14 South Long - 119. 40 East -

Tuesday Nov 15<sup>th</sup> 1836  
Continues Light winds and fine weather all hands  
Employed in ships (Duty) Middle parts much the  
same at Day light saw a ship Boiling; Latter parts  
gentle Breezes so ends Lat's By Obs -  
Long -

Wednesday Nov 16<sup>th</sup> 1836  
Continues Light winds and fine weather at 4  
P.M. Spoke the ship *Minstead of London*  
33 months out with 2500 lbs of sperm  
Oil Bound home; Middle and Latter  
parts much the same all hands  
Employed in ships (Duty) so ends  
Lat's - 10. 03 South - Long -

Thursday Nov 17<sup>th</sup> 1836  
Commences fine Breezes from the Eastward and  
fine weather steering by the wind to the N. E. with  
all sail set Middle and Latter parts much  
the same at 10 A.M. saw the Sandall Wood  
Island Bearing N. N. East Dist 6 Leagues so ends  
Lat's By Obs - 10. 37 South Long - 118. 11 East

Friday Nov 18<sup>th</sup> 1836  
Continues fine Breezes and pleasant weather  
steering by the wind to the south and west Middle  
and Latter parts much the same so ends  
Lat's By Obs - 10. 33 South Long - 118. 11 East,
