

Saturday Nov 19th 1836

Continued much the same as above steering by the wind to the South and West with all sail set Middle and Latter parts Calm so ends there 24 hours Lat^s - 10° 33 South Long^s - 118° 45 East.

Sunday Nov 20th 1836

These 24 hours commenced light breezes and fine weather steering by the wind to the Eastward Middle and Latter parts much the same saw hump backs so ends there 24 hours Lat^s by Ob^s - 10° 37 South Long^s - 118° 55 East


Monday Nov 21st 1836

Continued much the same as above steering by the wind all hands employed in ships duty at 4 P.M. saw a school of black fish down Boat Waite Boat struck and killed one and took him along side and cut him in; steering S. S. East saw hump backs so ends there 24 hours - Lat^s by Ob^s - 11° 37 South Long^s by Ob^s - 119° 10 East


Tuesday Nov 22^d 1836

These 24 hours commenced light winds and fine weather steering as above saw hump backs at 4 P.M. saw a ship to the windward Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends Lat^s by Ob^s - 12° 26 South Long^s -

Wednesday Nov 23^d 1836

All these 24 hours light winds and fine weather steering S. S. East at 2 P.M. saw a school of sperm whales down Boat Starboard Boat struck and killed and took him along side  and set the watch quarter watches Middle parts much the same at daylight commenced cutting at 7 A.M. finished cutting and commenced boiling Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends Lat^s - 12° 50 South Long^s - 119° 15 East

Thursday Nov 24th 1836

Continued light winds and fine weather at 2 P.M. saw a school of sperm whales down Boat Starboard and Larboard Boats  Each struck and killed a whale and took them along side; Middle and Latter parts much the ^{same} at daylight commenced cutting at 5 P.M. finished cutting and commenced boiling so ends Lat^s by Ob^s - 12° 43 South Long^s - 119° 25 East

Friday Nov 25th 1836

Commenced strong breezes and fine weather all hands employed in boiling Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends there 24 hours Lat^s by Ob^s - 12° 50 South Long^s by Ob^s - 119° 30 East

Saturday Nov 26th 1836

Continued strong breezes and fine weather at meridian saw breeches supposed to be black fish all hands employed in boiling Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends there 24 hours Lat^s by Ob^s - 12° 21 South Long^s - 119° 28 East

Sunday Nov 27th 1836

Continued strong breezes and fine weather at 2 P.M. finished boiling all hands employed in cooping Oil Middle and Latter parts much the same saw hump backs so ends Lat^s - 12° 27 South Long^s - 119° 27 East

Monday Nov 28th 1836

Continued strong breezes and fine weather with a short sea Middle and Latter parts much the same at daylight commenced stowing down Oil saw breeches so ends so ends Lat^s by Ob^s - 12° 49 South Long^s - 119° 38 East

Tuesday Nov 29th 1836

Continued strong winds and rugged weather at 6 P.M. finished stowing down Oil Middle and Latter parts much the same saw hump backs so ends there 24 hours Lat^s - Long -
