

Wednesday Nov 30th 1836

Continues strong winds and fine weather with a heavy swell steering to the Southward and Eastward Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends these 24 hours Lat by Ob - 13. 23 South

Long by Chr - 119. 10 East

Thursday Dec 1st 1836

Continues much the same as above saw five Backs - Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends Lat by Ob - 13. 50 South Long - 119. 10 East

Friday Dec 2^d 1836

Continues strong winds and fine pleasant weather with passing clouds Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends Lat - 12. 42 South Long - 117. 30 E.

Saturday Dec 3^d 1836

Continues much the same as above steering by the wind to the South and West Middle and Latter parts much the same at Meridian saw a school of sperm whales so ends Lat by Ob - 13. 14 South Long - 117. 35 East

Sunday Dec 4th 1836

Continues much the same as above at 2 P.M. Down Boat and pursued the whales but did not get any steering by the wind to the South and West Middle and Latter parts much the same saw nothing of note so ends these 24 hours Lat by Ob - Long -

Monday Dec 5th 1836

Continues strong breezes and clear weather steering as above saw breeches Middle and Latter parts more moderate all hands Employed in Ships Duty so ends Lat - 15. 19 South Long - 117. 18 East

Tuesday Dec 6th 1836

Continues Moderate breezes and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the S. and West Middle and Latter parts much the same saw hump backs several Lat - 16. 30 S, Long - 117. 30 East -

Wednesday Dec 7th 1836

Still continues light breezes and fine weather steering by the wind as above all hands Employed in ships Duty Middle parts much the same so ends Lat - 17. 10 South Long - 117. 35 East

Thursday Dec 8th 1836

First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes and fine weather steering as above saw nothing of note the watch Employed in repairing sails Middle and Latter parts light breezes with a heavy sea running so ends Lat by Ob - 17. 18 South Long by Chr - 117. 26 East

Friday Dec 9th 1836

Continues light winds with a heavy swell saw nothing remarkable Middle and Latter parts much the same steering by the wind to the S. and West so ends Lat by Ob - 16. 28 South Long - 116. 26 East

Saturday Dec 10th 1836

These 24 hours commences strong breezes and clear weather at meridian tacked ship to the South and West saw nothing remarkable so ends these 24 hours Lat - 17. 50 South Long - 116. 31 East

Sunday Dec 11th 1836

First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes and clear weather steering as above; all hands Employed in Ships Duty Middle parts much the same at 8 A.M. raised a school of sperm whales Down Boat, Whistle Boat struck Iron Binnacle Larboard Boat struck but soon drewed Boat gave up the chase and came on Board whales going quick so ends Lat by Ob - 18. 16 South Long by Chr - 116. 02 East

Monday Dec 12th 1836

These 24 hours commences light breezes and fine weather Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends Lat by Ob - 18. 38 South Long by Chr - 116. 40 East
