

Tuesday Decr 13th 1836
Continued the same as above steering by the wind to the Westward Saw nothing of note Middle parts calm at 10 A.M. raised a large sperm whale down boats and pursued the whale so ends these 24 hours Lat By Obs. 18.50 South Long

Wednesday Decr 14th 1836
First part of these 24 hours calm at 4 P.M. gave up the chase and came on board whale going quick; Middle and latter parts much the same saw hump backs so ends Lat By Obs. 18.24 South Long 115.14 East

Thursday Decr 15th 1836
Continued much the same as above steering N.N.E. by compass Middle and latter parts strong breezes and clear weather Saw hump back whales so ends Lat By Obs. 18.12 South Long By Obs. 115.30 East

Friday Decr 16th 1836
Continued strong breezes with a heavy swell steering by the wind to the S.E. East Caught a Dolphin Middle and latter parts more moderate Saw nothing remarkable so ends Lat By Obs. 18.00 South Long 114.17 East

Saturday Decr 17th 1836
First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes and clear weather steering by the wind to the South & E. Saw nothing Middle parts strong breezes latter parts much the same Saw fin backs so ends these 24 hours Lat By Obs. 18.10 South Long By Obs. 115.57 East

Sunday Decr 18th 1836
Continued strong breezes and clear weather steering by the wind as above Middle and latter parts much the same so ends Lat By Obs. 18.15 South Long By Obs. 115.00 East

Monday Decr 19th 1836
Continued the same as above steering by the wind to the South and East Saw nothing of note Middle and latter parts much the same so ends Lat By Obs. 18.21 South Long By Obs. 115.33 East

Tuesday Decr 20th 1836
Continued light breezes with a heavy sea steering as above Saw black fish Middle and latter parts strong breezes and clear weather so ends Lat By Obs. 19.11 South Long By Obs. 115.48 East

Wednesday Decr 21st 1836
Continued strong breezes and haggled weather steering by the wind to the South and East Middle and latter parts much the same so ends these 24 hours Lat By Obs. 18.45 South Long By Obs. 115.30 East

Thursday Decr 22^d 1836
First part of these 24 hours more moderate with a heavy sea running at 2 P.M. raised a large sperm whale down boats and pursued the whale, at 4 P.M. boats came on board whale going quick to the windward Middle and latter parts much the same all hands employed in ship's duty so ends Lat 18.48 South Long By Obs. 112.48 E.

Friday Decr 23^d 1836
Continued light breezes and fine weather steering by the wind to the South and West Saw nothing of note Middle and latter parts much the same Saw hump backs so ends Lat By Obs. 19.13 South Long By Obs. 112.19 East

Saturday Decr 24th 1836
Continued the same as above steering by the wind to the South and East Middle and latter parts much the same Saw hump back whales so ends these 24 hours Lat By Obs. 19.54 South Long By Obs. 113.30 East
