

Friday Jan 6<sup>th</sup> 1837

Continued the same as above steering by the wind to the southward and westward. Saw  
Peregrine supposed to be Grampases Middle and  
Latter Parts much the same so ends. Lat By - 22.55  
Long - 119.40 East

Saturday Jan 7<sup>th</sup> 1837

Still continues strong breezes and rugged  
weather Ship going to under close reefed  
top sails heading the same as above Middle and  
Latter Parts much the same so ends. Lat - 27.37  
Long -

Sunday Jan 8<sup>th</sup> 1837

Commenced more moderate with a heavy swell  
steering by the wind. Saw nothing of note  
at 9 A.M. filled away for the Christmas  
Islands steering N. N. West by compass at 11  
A.M. saw a large sperm whale Middle  
and Latter Parts much the same so ends  
Lat By Ob - 25.15 South Long by Chron - 105.20 East

Monday Jan 9<sup>th</sup> 1837

Continued much the same as above Ship under  
Easy Sail Middle and Latter parts much the  
same saw whale spots, supposed to be sperm  
whale so ends these 24 hours Lat - 22.44 South  
Long by Chron - 105.00 East

Tuesday Jan 10<sup>th</sup> 1837

These 24 hours continues rugged weather with  
frequent squalls of rain. At 4 P.M. raised  
a school of sperm whales Down Boats and continued  
chase until 4 P.M. gave up the chase  
and came on board. Middle and Latter Parts the  
same so ends. Lat. 21.00 South Long - 108.17 East

Wednesday Jan 11<sup>th</sup> 1837

Continued much the same as above steering N. N. W.  
by compass. Saw nothing remarkable Middle and  
Latter Parts much the same the watch employed  
in setting up the main rigging so ends  
Lat By Ob - 19.00 South Long by Chron - 108.00 East

Thursday Jan 12<sup>th</sup> 1837

Commenced more moderate with frequent squalls  
of rain Middle and Latter Parts. Light breezes  
and fine weather steering N. by compass the watch  
employed in sending out Mission to Gallant Yards  
so ends these 24 hours. Lat By Ob - 17.50 South  
Long by Chron - 105.06 East

Friday Jan 13<sup>th</sup> 1837

Continued light breezes and fine weather steering  
the same as above. Saw nothing of note Middle  
and Latter parts much the same steering N. East  
by compass so ends. Lat 16.07 South Long - 105.14 East

Saturday Jan 14<sup>th</sup> 1837

Continued much the same as above steering N. East  
by compass. Saw a lone shark at 11 A.M.  
Heaved to the wind heading to the westward the  
watch employed in ship duty so ends.  
Lat By Ob - 14.19 South Long - 105.10 East

Sunday Jan 15<sup>th</sup> 1837

These 24 hours begins with gentle breezes and fine  
weather at 1 P.M. saw a school of sperm  
whales. Down Boats in pursuit. Larboard  
Boat struck and killed a whale, Waiste  
Boat struck and got stove cut their line and  
returned to the ship. Starboard Boat struck and  
killed a whale at 6 P.M. took the whales along side.  
At Day Light Commenced cutting in. At 8 A.M. saw  
a school of sperm whales at 11 A.M. Down two Boats  
in pursuit so ends. Lat 14.21 South Long - 105.00 East
