These 24 hours begins with light winds from the south and fine weather steering N. by West Middle part much the same latter parts pleasant Gale with flying clouds heading N. by West so ends

Monday Jan 30th 1837
These 24 hours begins with strong winds from the westward with thick weather steering as above Middle and latter parts much the same at 10. A. M. saw the Cocca Islands bearing N. by West Dist. 5 Leagues so ends

Tuesday Jan 31st 1837
Continues strong breezes from the West with frequent squalls of rain at 3 P. M. starboard boat went on shore at 10. A. M. came to anchor at the Cocca Islands so ends
Lat. By Ob. 12. 00 South Long. 97. 04 East -

Wednesday Feb 1st 1837
At 1 P. M. took a keft of casks on shore for water all hands employed in taking water on board so ends
Lat. By Ob. Long. -

Thursday Feb 2^d 1837
All hands employed in getting water on board so ends these 24 hours
Lat. Long. -

Friday Feb 3^d 1837
All these 24 hours strong breezes from the West starboard watch on shore on Liberty so ends
Lat. Long. -

Saturday Feb 4th 1837
All these 24 hours strong winds with frequent squalls of rain starboard watch on shore on Liberty so ends these 24 hours

Sunday Feb 5th 1837
Commenced heavy Gale of wind with frequent squalls of rain at 3 A. M. set up the starboard anchor at 9 A. M. sent down top Gallant yards and hoisted the fore and mizzen top Gallant masts so ends these 24 hours

Monday Feb 6th 1837
These 24 hours begins fine weather starboard watch on Liberty the starboard watch employed in heaving up the starboard anchor so ends
Lat. Long. -

Tuesday Feb 7th 1837
These 24 hours continues fine weather the starboard watch on Liberty the starboard watch employed in fitting the anchor &c. so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday Feb 8th 1837
All hands employed in sending up top Gallant masts yards &c. so ends

Thursday Feb 9th 1837
All hands employed in taking recruits on board so ends these 24 hours
Lat. Long. -

Friday Feb 10th 1837
These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze; at 3 P. M. weighed our anchor and sailed from the Cocca Islands with a pleasant breeze from the S. East and fine weather all hands employed in striking the anchor chain so ends

Saturday Feb 11th 1837
Continues gentle breeze and fine weather steering by the wind all hands employed in Ships Duty so ends
Lat. By Ob. 12. 17 South Long. 98. 00 East
