Saturday March 11th 1837

Continued much the same as above Steering South
1/2 East at 8 A.M. Unlaced the Main Sail and
Repaired it At 1/2 Past 5 Bent it again saw
Nothing Remarkable Middle and Latter Parts
Light Breezes and fine weather so much
Latd By Obs. 29.36 South Long. 106.07 East

Sunday March 12th 1837

Commenced strong Breezes and good weather steering
By the wind saw Nothing Middle and Latter
parts equally. At 11 A.M. Saw a water spout
so much Latd. 29.06 South Long. 107.47 East

Monday March 13th 1837

Continued equally weather at meridian saw a
school of sperm whales Down Boats and pursued
the whales at 3 P.M. Boats came on board at 4 P.M.
Saw another whale Down two Boats and pursued
the whale at 5 P.M. gave up the chase and
came on Board Doubled Reeled the fore and misser
to sails and set the watch Boats crews Middle and
Parts strong Breezes and Rugged weather saw
Nothing so much Latd. 28.11 South Long. 108.41 East

Tuesday March 14th 1837

Continued strong Breezes and Rugged Weather
steering By the wind to the Eastward saw nothing
Remarkable Middle and Latter Parts much the
same so much there 24 hours Latd. 27.47 South
Long. 110.08 East

Wednesday March 15th 1837

Continued fresh Gales with a heavy sea running
Saw nothing Remarkable at 6 P.M. took in the
Main sail Gib and spanker Middle and Latter
parts much the same so much Latd.

Thursday March 16th 1837

These 24 hours much the same as above Steering By
the wind to the Southward and Eastward saw nothing
Remarkable the watch Employed in setting up
Misser to Gallant Back stays so much Latd.

Friday March 17th 1837

These 24 hours commenced Light Breezes and fine
weather steering South East By the wind saw of
Note Middle and Latter Parts Calm saw
Black fish so much Latd. 27.45 South
Long. 111.38 East

Saturday March 18th

Commenced strong Breezes and clear weather
steering By the wind to the Northward and West
ward saw Breezes Middle and Latter Parts
more moderate saw Grampases so much Latd. 21.51 S.
Long. 109.09 East

Sunday March 19th 1837

Continued moderate Breezes and fine weather
steering N. West By compass At 5 P.M. saw
Breeches at 6 P.M. Luffed to the wind heading
N. By N. Middle and Latter parts much the
same saw Grampases so much Latd By Obs. 26.36 South
Long By Chron. 109.09 East

Monday March 20th 1837

These 24 hours commenced strong Breezes and clear
weather steering N. N. West By compass saw
nothing Remarkable Middle and Latter Parts more
moderate steering West By N. saw Breeches so much
Latd By Obs. 26.11 South Long By Chron. 108.53
East
