

Tuesday March 21st 1837

Continued light breezes and fine weather steering by the wind saw nothing of note at 6 P.M. Shortened sail and set the watch Boats crews Middle and Latter parts strong breezes and clear weather saw porpoises so ends
Lat By Ob- 25. 50 South Long - 108. 36 East

Wednesday March 22nd 1837

Continued strong breezes with flying clouds steering by the wind to the southward and Eastward saw nothing Middle and Latter parts much the same saw breeches steering N.E. By East so ends Lat By Ob- 25. 00 South Long By Ob- -

Thursday March 23rd 1837

Still continued strong breezes and hazy weather steering as above saw breeches Middle and Latter parts more moderate so ends
Lat By Ob- 23. 41 South Long - 111. 22 East

Friday March 24th 1837

These 24 hours commenced light breezes and fine weather steering N.E. By East saw breeches at 7 P.M. set our fore and mizzen to Gallant sails Middle and Latter parts much the same steering N. East By Compass so ends these 24 hours
Lat By Ob- 23. 03 South Long - 112. 02 East

Saturday March 25th 1837

Continued gentle breezes and fine weather steering N. East By compass saw fin backs Middle and Latter parts strong breezes with squalls of rain At 5 P.M. Double reefed the top sails so ends Lat By Ob- Long -

Sunday March 26th 1837

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes and squally weather steering East N.E. By compass at 3 P.M. commenced more moderate at 5 P.M. made all sail on the ship saw nothing Middle and Latter parts light breezes and fine weather saw whale spouts so ends Lat - 20. 31 South Long - 115. 08 East

Monday March 27th 1837

These 24 hours commenced calm and clear weather steering N. East By N. By compass saw nothing Remarkable Middle and Latter parts much the same so ends Lat - 19. 36 South Long - 115. 42 East

Tuesday March 28th 1837

Continued light breezes and fine weather steering N. East By compass saw nothing Middle and Latter parts strong breezes and clear weather steering by the wind to the southward and Eastward so ends Lat By Ob- 18. 18 South Long - 116. 51 East

Wednesday March 29th 1837

Continued strong breezes and fine weather steering as above saw nothing Remarkable Middle and Latter parts light breezes and fine weather steering to the N. and East saw black fish so ends Lat By Ob- 17. 43 South Long - 117. 38 East

Thursday March 30th 1837

Continued moderate breezes and fine weather steering as above saw breeches Middle and Latter parts much the same at 6 A.M. saw a school of sperm whales down boats Waite boat struck and killed one and took him along side so ends Lat - 37. 38 South Long 117. 50 East
