

Remarks on board Ship Herald of New Bedford

Monday May 15th pleasant breeze from the N. W. Steer-
ing S. W. and S. E. weather squally. Nothing in
sight during the day except Frampereis and Bird.
At 1 P.M. shortened sail, and at 4 P.M. set it again.
Tuesday May 16th Moderate breeze from the N. W. Steer-
ing S. W. under all sail until 6 A.M. when took in the light sails, and
double reefed the Topsail and foredrib and Main sail
weather squally and very unpleasant. one vessel in sight
barring N. W. Steer-
ing S. W. saw during the day
a school of Frampereis at 1 P.M. set whole Topsails
foredrib and spanker, weather squally at 4 P.M.
double reefed the Topsails employed no vessels Lat

Wednesday May 17th light breeze from the N. W. Steer-
ing S. W. weather clear and pleasant, at 1 P.M. set all sail
but at 4 P.M. took in but double reefed Topsail, at 4
P.M. set all sail, a Ship bearing N. W. about 10
miles distant we spoke her the Commodore Morris one
week out from Whales 60 lbs, and got some letters
and papers, employed no vessels nothing in sight
during the day except the Commodore

Thursday May 18th fresh wind from the N. Steer-
ing to the N. W. and S. E. under all sail until
4 P.M. took in the light sails, at 5 P.M. wind increas-
ing double reefed the Topsails foredrib and Main
sails foredrib and spanker, set fore and Main
Spencers the Commodore just in sight to leeward Lat Long

Friday May 19th fresh wind from the N. W. Steer-
ing S. W. and S. E. under all sail until 4 P.M.
the wind changed to the S. E. we shortened sail
wind like the back of the weather to windward
took in all sail except Spencers, double reefed Main
sail and foredrib and Main sail, weather quite squally
at 4 P.M. set all sail and steered to the S. E. until
2 P.M. heaved to the wind, one vessel in sight steering
N. W. about five miles distant Lat Long

Saturday May 20th Moderate wind from the S. W.
weather very pleasant at 4 P.M. shortened sail at 4
P.M. set all sail, one vessel in sight bearing S. E. steer-
ing N. W. weather clear and pleasant at 6 P.M. saw a
Ship about 11 miles off steering to the N. W. under
all sail, nothing else in sight during the day
at 1 P.M. Lat 41° 15' North Star 54.10

Sunday May 21st Moderate wind from the S. W.
steering S. W. until 2 P.M. heaved one point S. E.
at 6 P.M. shortened sail, weather quite squally, at 6 P.M.
set all sail, at 1 P.M. raised a Ship steering towards
us about twelve miles off, weather quite squally at 4 P.M.
and at the first part of P.M. the rest of the day clear
and pleasant. Lat Long

Monday May 22nd
light breeze from the S. E. weather quite unpleasant
one vessel in sight during the day employed no vessels
at 1 P.M. shortened sail, but at 4 P.M. set it again nothing
in sight during the day Lat Long
