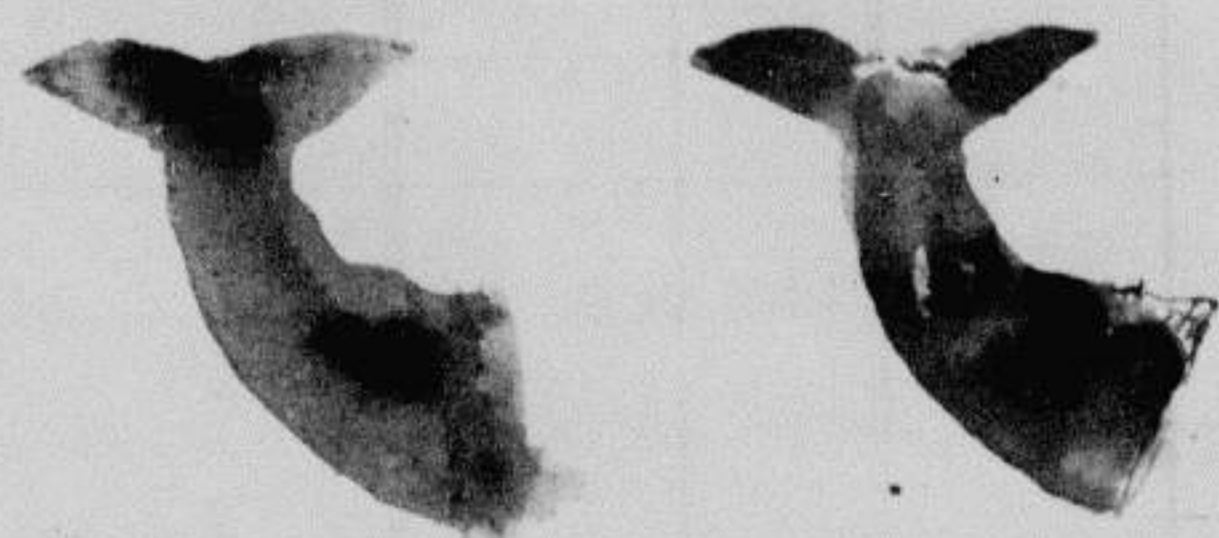


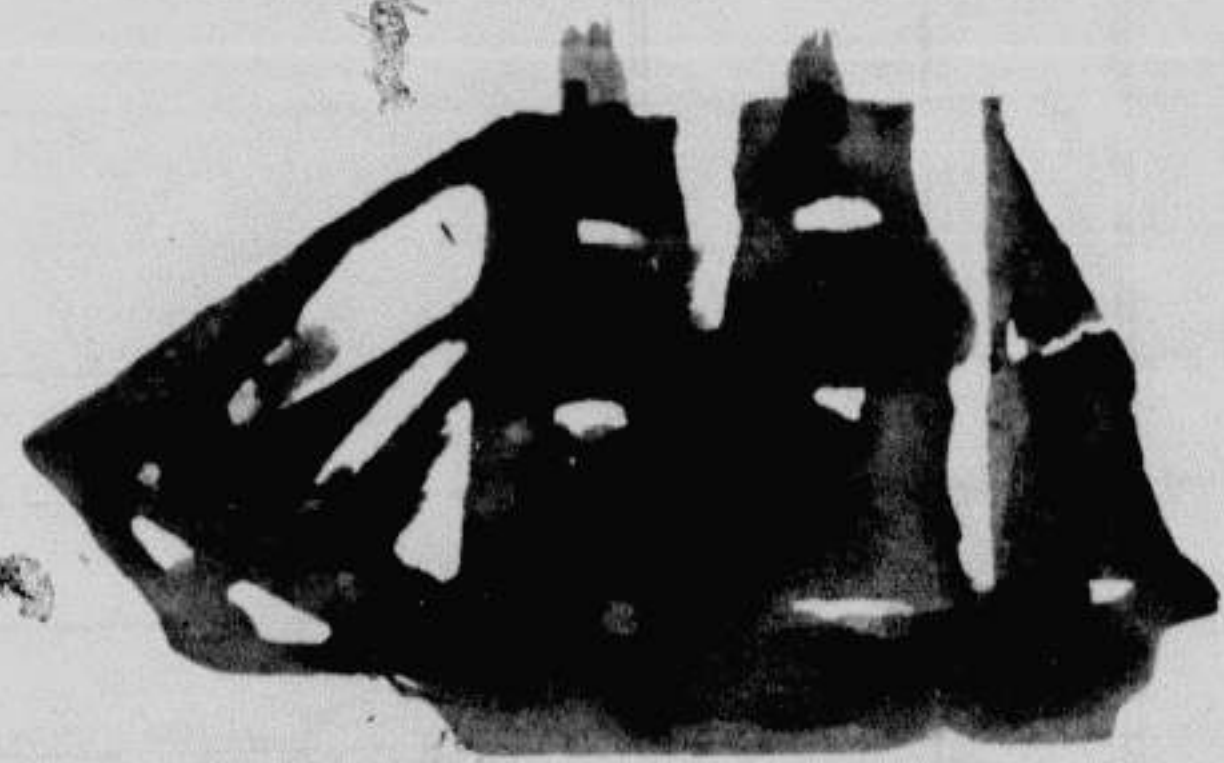
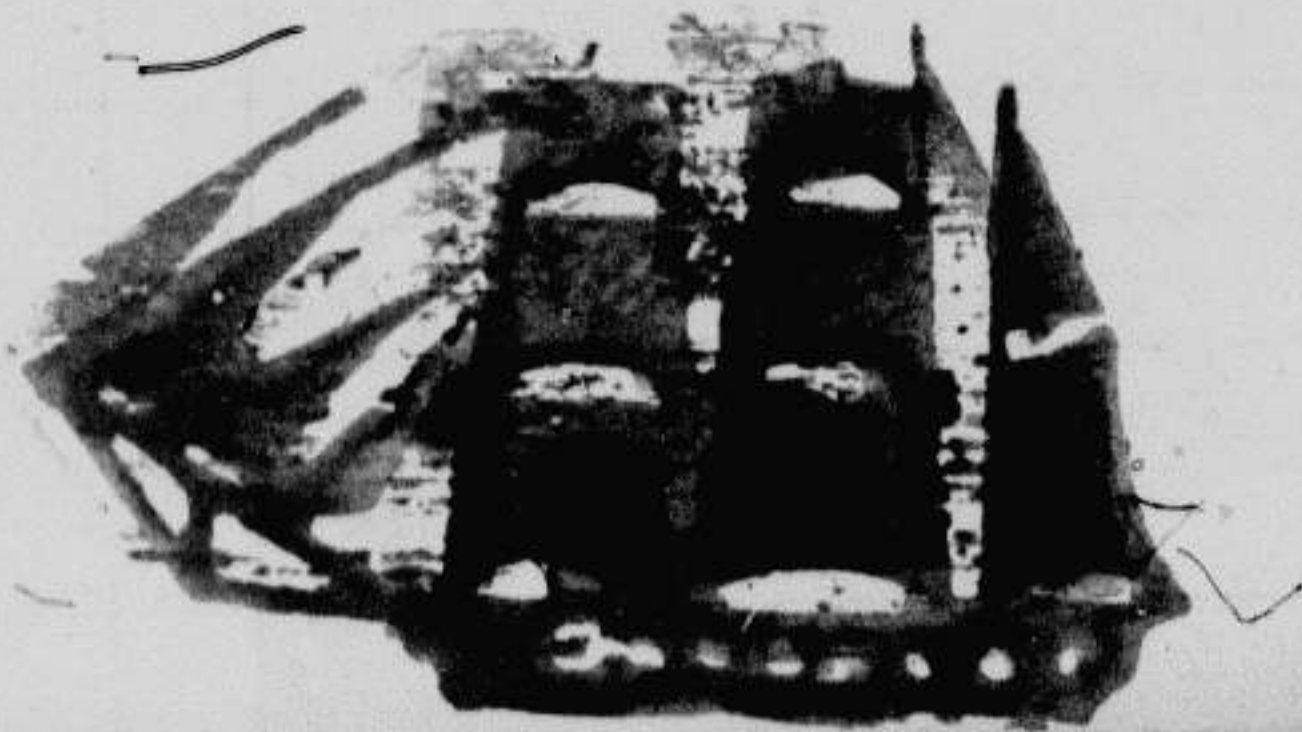
Remarks on board Ship Herald of New Bedford

At 1 P.M. started the work



Monday Sept 18th light breeze continue at 1 P.M. set
double reefed Topsails, Foresail and Jib steering S.
S.W. Wind from the North-West continue boilem-
-g a Bark passed quite near to us, going to the East
ward. At 8 P.M. finished boiling at 8 P.M. thirty bbls.
set all sail. weather clear and pleasant. At 10 P.M. two ves-
-els in sight, both steering about East, employed
in cleaning up decks. Lat Long

Tuesday Sept 19th light wind from from the S.W.
steering S. S.W. under all sail, until 6 P.M. took in
the light sails. At 6 P.M. commenced to stow down the
oil finished at 11 P.M. showing thirty five barrels
have vessels in sight quite near us a Bark and
Brig both steering to the Eastward weather very favor-
-able

Wednesday Sept 20th fresh wind from the N.W.
steering to the S. S.W. until 6 P.M. wore ship
and shortened sail. No double reefed Main top-
sail and star sail. Two Merchant men in sight
and the Bark Cassius. of N. B. At 8 P.M. gave
-d here, we set double reefed Topsails, Foresails, Jib &
-Spanker, and she had single top sails. At 12 O'clo-
-k, she about two miles a Stern, weather quite favor-
-able. The Cassius having seen Whales four times
and got twenty five bbls. Lat 36.10. Long 48.07

Thursday Sept 21st moderate breeze from the N.W.
steering to the N.W. under bare sail at 1 P.M. set
whole Main top sail and courses. weather quite
pleasant. employed in sending up the fore top gal-
-lery mast, and yard. have vessels in sight also the
Cassius, five miles off a Stern steering N. E. nothing else
in sight during the day. Lat 35.20 Long 48.15

Friday Sept 22nd light breeze from the S. S.W. steering
S. W. At 5 P.M. raised a game of F. Whales about 4 mi-
-les off, going very fast to windward. At 6 P.M. lowered
three Boats but did not get very near them. as soon as
we saved them we set all sail. we chased them until
-all dark then went about and took in the light
sails. at 10 P.M. took out all sail. employed messengers
nothing in sight. a very heavy roller on swell. In
Lat. 36.00 Long 48.07
