Remarks on board Ship Herald of New Bedford

Wednesday Oct 11th Light wind from the S. E. W. steering S. E. At 6 Pm furled the light sails and Gibs. and closed down the Topsails and let them hang until 6 Am and all sail weather quite pleasant At 5 Pm the Mizzen Top sail finished bent it employed necessarily one Bask in sight Merchant man steering to the Eastward Lat 42.25 Long

Thursday Oct 12th favorable wind from the N. W. W. At 1 Pm sent down the Fore Top gallant sail reared it and bent it again weather favorable continue steering S. E. W. until 5 Pm shortened sail to about reefed Topsails heading S. E. W. At 5 Pm saw Black Fish & Cow Fish blow to the ship At 6 Am set all sail steering S. E. W. going at the rate of 5 to 6 knots. employed in repairing the Main sail Lat 42.25 Long

Friday Oct 13th At Pm it died away calm. took in the light sails At 1 Pm it breezed up from the S. W. set whole Topsails. Top sail gallant sail. At 10 Am wind increasing about reefed the Fore and Mizzen Top sail and took in the Top sail gallant sail. At 6 Am sent the Main sail Ship going at the rate of 7 to 8 knots. weather squally and cloudy Lat. Long No Obs

Saturday Oct 14th Strong wind continue from the S. E. W. steering S. E. W. At 4 Pm set Main Top gallant sail. weather quite pleasant after 4 Pm. At 4 Am it pressed up from the Westward took in the Top gallant sail and dble reefed the Main Top sail & took in the Mizzen sail. weather squally At 8 Am it moderated set. Fore sail single reefed Main Top sail. ship going at the rate of 7 to 8 knots but sailing very heavy. employed in sweeping out. At 10 Am continue steering S. E. W. nothing in sight during the day Lat 39.35 Long 42.25
Sunday Oct 15th Strong wind from the N. W. until 1 Pm it moderated a little continue steering to the Eastward until 10 Pm spoke the Commerce Smith Capt. Sherman. At 6 Am carried the Ship Mainwara Smith of N. B. Capt. Sherman. the Koonas and one Merchant ship in sight. weather quite favorable. At 6 Am set whole Topsails. Courses and Main Top gallant sail Lat 39.27. Long 41.14
Monday Oct 16th Moderate wind from the N. W. continue carrying with Capt Sherman until 5 Pm. the Bask Koonas wanting to gain bad. but we did not feel inclined. At 6 Pm took in the Main sail & Top gallant sail steering N. until 9 1/2 finished getting out Water and stored S. E. for Lgal. At 10 Am wind increasing dble reefed and furled Fore & Mizzen Topsails. weather quite favorable Lat.
