

Remarks on board Ship Herald of New Bedford
 being at Anchoa in Sagal in the month of Oct.
 Monday Oct 23rd weather pleasant. employed in break-
 ing out the oil and rendering it ashore 4741 gallons
 at anchor. Bark Wm. of N. B. Capt. Has not done very well
 and the Com^{dr}. Morris, Capt. Hayward 200 barrels, five
 month out, saying of and on. Tuesday 24th the Carboard
 watch went ashore and three men took French
 leaf (there are no more) the steward and two of the
 fore mast hands employed in getting of fifty lbs
 water and twelve barrels meat. Wednesday 25th
 the other watch went ashore and only one came a-
 board employed in stowing down the water in the
 fore hold. We had quite a time with the cook
 being in ^{trouble} out of his ^{head} with Liegner and had to
 fight lions on him and keep them so until
 he got sober. Thursday 26th arrived Bark Wm. of
 N. B. eleven month out with five lbs. sperm
 Capt. Also Bark Poonchar Capt. Crapo
 seven months one hundred barrels do. sailed
 Bark. John Dossou, B. Luria B. Trope Bird and
 a Merchantman the Died Hotel of Liverpool
 Friday 27th shipped a Steward and came aboard a
 Spaniard a small man I think, and got several
 barrels of Potatoes, sweet and with some fresh
 meat. weather quite favorable employed in stowing the
 Port Anchoa and Chain. our port chain bent on the
 the Cannels meaning that we took the day we
 came in Saturday 28th weather quite unfavorable
 having a gail from the South west employed

John H. Gillies Commander weighed anchor and left
 Sagal for the river Rio-del-a-Plata
 Monday Oct 29th fresh wind from the
 N. N. W. at 11 AM bore short and let go the Cannels
 anchor and it ran down on the top of our anchor
 it was six hours before we got it clear then went
 ashore with the Pilot. then steered S. by E. under
 whole top sails & top gallant sail employed in stowing
 anchor and Chain. At 3 PM let our prisoners on
 deck in number that came aboard last night.
 weather pleasant. At 4 PM the Ozeola, Barb. S. la Brissian
 Ship got under way. the Bark Trope Bird Capt.
 Adams saying of and on. At 11 PM wind from
 the N. N. W. Monday Oct 30th fresh wind continue
 from the Eastward. steering S. by E. at 1 PM set
 all sail, ship going at the rate of 6 to 8 knots em-
 ployed variously. Here vessels in sight. the Bark
 steering N. by W. the Ship about 1 PM. Lat 36. 28
 Longitude 57. 10
 Tuesday Oct 31st fresh wind
 from the S. E. steering S. by E. at 10 PM wind
 increasing took in the light sails at 1 PM set the
 top Gallant sail. but did not carry them
 very length of time. ship going at the rate of 5 to
 6 knots. weather quite pleasant. one vessel in
 sight steering N. by W. employed in breaking
 out water out of the Chain hole. Lat 33.
 Longitude
