 New Bedford in the month of
 Sunday Oct 28th moderate breeze from the N. W. at
 Pm. Steering on the tack that we can make the
 most westward on. at 4pm shortened sail head-
 ing N. E. W. Weather quite pleasant. Two vessels
 in sight steering to the E.ward Lat 34.30

Long 63.20 Monday Oct 29th fresh
 breezes continue from N. E. Steering N. by
 E under all sail except top gallant sail and 1st of it
 at 4pm. at 5pm set all sail. Wind from the N. E. Steering
 N. E. W. under all sail. Ship going at
 the rate of 4 to 5 knots. employed in clearing
 the oil boiler and Persp Cocher and putting them
 down below in the fore hold Lat 34.30

Long 65.22 Tuesday Oct 30th fairable wind from the E. S. E.
 Steering N. E. W. Ship going at the rate of 6 to 7 knots
 at 1.30 wind increasing into from the E. S. W. was a
 light to shoot most sail to double reef top sail and
 fore sail. at 4pm shipped a quite a heavy and she began
 to roll so that we took in the reefed fore sail and
 shot reefed the main top sail and luffed to the
 wind heading S. W. and S. W. W. weather quite clear
 but some squally. employed 10 persons
