 The first part of there is now being with good weather
 down the South river in opposite to that of a previous
 day. The first night and moderate later part rather
 fine and clear at 5 PM had all hands at it. At 11 o'clock
 as it fell back the wheel slipped in between the shore
 then the ship which move for several hours is now
 (11) *Monrovia* *Jan 18*
 The first part of there is now being with fine and
 pleasant weather with light wind from the South
 impeded in having the wheel cut at 5 PM got the wheel
 low the ship, and began cutting at 9 PM looked
 down with a great weather which the rain
 later part rather fine with moderate breeze
 from the North and low in cutting two boats a
 whirling saw articles of cast but could not fasten
 at 1 PM finished cutting and began building

June 22. The boat sailed down the River at 4 AM. The boat cabin on land saw plenty of wharves but could not pass within 100 yds. The river later part was more navigable at 8 AM. We left all boats at 6 AM. saw a wharf but could not pass and from the south with bright breezes nothing more was seen. There is a house

Remarks. On the 20th of June the first part of these columns began with fire and pleasant weather, with moderate breeze from the North. The boats a scuffling saw a whaler cross, but could not get near, and later part weather misty, the vessels at 5 o'clock were three boats, saw a whaler cross, but did not get near, or nothing more was seen, except these columns.
