Remarks On Board Friday June 17<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze and pleasant weather  
steering by the wind to the West Employed  
stowing down the Middle part light breeze from the  
South steering for the West Latter part pleasant  
at 10 AM saw a school of whales and saved at 12 struck  
two of them at 3 the vessel went got above and lost  
a man by the manner swimming he was taken out  
the boat by the lines killed 3 whales at 11 took them  
along side, Commenced butting 30 barrels

at 11 AM 22° 08' Long by Chronometer - 36 34 East  
Remarks On Saturday June 18<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze from the South  
steering to the West Employed butting at 4 PM  
finished at 5 were ship to the S.W. at 9 were

Remarks On Sunday June 19<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with moderate breeze from S.E. & S.  
steering by the wind to the S.W. at 2 PM saw  
whales to the windward lowered 100 Bales struck  
and killed 2 of them and saved one at 3 took him  
along side Middle part calm and pleasant Employed  
butting Latter part the same at 7 AM commenced butting  
at 8 finished 100 Bales Lat 11° 35' S Long 37° 56' E

Remarks On Monday June 20<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze from the West  
steering to the East wind Middle part pleasant  
weather at 8 AM finished butting  
Latter part calm and pleasant Employed  
stowing down the Middle part in company with the  
Tobacco Plant to End Lat 11° 22' S

Remarks On Tuesday June 21<sup>st</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze from the westward  
steering to the South Employed stowing down  
Middle part light breeze from the South  
steering on wind to the Westward  
Latter part much the same steering to the S.W.  
Employed stowing down Oil Lat 11° 28' S

Remarks On Wednesday June 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Commenced with fresh breeze from the South  
steering West at 7 AM steaming by the course to the  
Eastward at midday were ship to the West  
Latter part fresh breeze from the South steering  
W. at 9 AM saw the land bearing 70° West  
to W. South at 10 AM saw the land bearing 130° and saw  
bearing 100° at 10 AM saw the land bearing 100° and saw  
with tobacco plant Lat 11° 28' S

Remarks On Thursday June 23<sup>rd</sup>  
Commenced with light wind from the South  
steering by the wind to the S.W. at 4 PM  
saw a school of whales 8 fathoms of water  
Middle part light breeze and pleasant weather  
Latter part the same at 8 AM lowered the Boat  
to take a look around the Bay could not near a  
whale to End this Day

Soon after the vessel had  
when there with his Boat  
in view the shot man by  
the name Fisher it is not a  
man who would be of power to  
be in considerable harm

Remarks On Friday June 24<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light wind and pleasant  
at 3 PM the Boat came on Board  
Middle part pleasant  
Latter part the same at 8 AM saw one  
Right whale lowered toward the South not further  
kept away struck and killed her to End

Remarks On Saturday June 25<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze from the  
Eastward with fine pleasant weather  
Middle part the same  
Latter part calm and pleasant two Boats  
a whaling at 8 AM saw two whales from the Ship  
lowered the other Boat could not further at 10 AM the  
left hand of Commenced to approach the whales came  
down and took Board and tobacco from them

Remarks On Sunday June 26<sup>th</sup> 1831  
Commenced with light breeze from the West  
with fine pleasant weather at 3 PM the Boat  
a long side Middle part fresh breeze from the South  
and clear weather Latter part breeze from the  
West at 3 AM saw two whales Reged did not  
lower to End this Day

Remarks On Monday June 27<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with strong breeze from the West  
clear weather Middle part same took the same  
Latter part strong breeze and Reged  
at 8 AM saw three whales  
at 11 got under way and steered to the South  
until we got in 12 fathoms then came to anchor

Remarks On Tuesday June 28<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with moderate breeze from the South  
and pleasant two Boats of whaling  
Middle part much the same  
Latter part strong breeze at 7 AM saw two whales  
lowered for them struck and killed one of them  
the tobacco plant Boat to the West anchored here  
and came on Board to End this Day



Remarks On Board Wednesday June 29<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with moderate breeze and squally  
at 1 PM lowered Boats to tow whales to ship  
at 2 PM on squally and Reged came on Board  
again Middle part much the same  
Latter part light breeze and pleasant at 7 AM  
got the ship under way and ran down to the whale  
at noon got the whale a long side to End this Day

Remarks On Thursday June 30<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze and pleasant  
at 2 PM commenced butting at 5 finished  
Middle part fine weather at 6 AM commenced  
Bailing Latter part fresh breeze from the West  
at 7 AM got under way and ran up to have mee  
by before and came to anchor again

Remarks On Friday July 1<sup>st</sup> 1831  
Commenced with fresh breeze and fine weather  
Employed Bailing  
Middle part much the same  
Latter part strong breeze from the West  
at 6 AM finished Bailing at 8 AM saw one whale  
going to the Westward Reged did not  
lower to End this Day

Remarks On Saturday July 2<sup>nd</sup>  
Commenced with moderate breeze from the  
West and pleasant Employed Bailing out  
two Boats and Bailing the Boat to put water  
in at 4 AM saw two whales lowered could not further  
Middle part fine weather  
Latter part much the same at 6 AM saw one  
whale lowered toward the South not further

Remarks On Sunday July 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze from the South  
with fine pleasant weather Employed stowing  
down Oil Middle part pleasant  
Latter part much the same at 10 AM finished  
stowing down to End this Day

Remarks On Monday July 4<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light wind from the South  
Employed stowing oil and other necessary jobs  
Middle part steady with squalls of wind and light  
Latter part light breeze from the South did with  
see nothing to End this Day
