

Remarks On Board Sept 18th 1831

Commenced with pleasant breeze from the S.E. East
Turning at 4 P.M. all hands employed in ship
Daily Middle Part fine pleasant weather
Latter Part much the same turning at West
at 6 P.M. saw a ship steering by the wind to the
West Sailed Lat 11° 35' 45" Long by Chronometer 13° 31'

Remarks On Board Monday Sept 19th

Commenced with light breeze from the S.W. West
with fine pleasant weather at 2 P.M. saw two Right
Whales, one of which was killed and brought on board
at 5 P.M. took him a very nice cow two Whales
brought again could not partur
Middle Part fine pleasant weather
Latter Part fresh gale from the W. West at 4 P.M.
Commenced with fine pleasant weather at 4 P.M. finished
at noon with the ship at Lat 11° 35' 45" Long by Chronometer 13° 31'

Remarks On Tuesday Sept 20th

Commenced with fresh gale from the W. West
heading to the S.W. West under sail. Cape visible main
top gale and wind force sail at 1 P.M. Commenced
Bailing Middle Part fresh gale from the W. West
attended with squalls of Rain
Latter Part much the same fresh breeze
bailing at 4 P.M. were ship to the S.W. West Sailed
Lat 11° 35' 18" South

Remarks On Wednesday Sept 21st

Commenced with fresh gale from the W. West
heading to the S.W. West under sail. Cape visible
bailing Middle Part fresh gale from the W. West
at 4 P.M. took in the fore sail at midnight finished
bailing Latter Part strong gale and squalls
Sailed Lat 11° 35' 45" South

Remarks On Thursday Sept 22nd

Commenced with strong gale from the W. West
with heavy squalls. Tying up headed to the S.W. West
Middle Part the gale more moderate
Latter Part moderate gale and fair weather
at 2 P.M. were ship to the S.W. West rest the fore
and main top sails and took Sailed Lat 11° 35' 35" S

Remarks On Friday Sept 23rd

Commenced with moderate breeze from the W. West
turning by the wind to the S.W. West, employed
bailing out and stowing down. Middle Part light breeze and fair weather
Latter Part much the same employed sawing
stowing down at 4 P.M. were ship to the S.W. West
at 11 P.M. saw one Right whale could not partur
Sailed Lat 11° 35' 28" South

Remarks On Board Saturday Sept 24th

Commenced with fresh breeze from the W. West
and fair weather turning by the wind to the S.W. West
Middle Part much the same
Latter Part fresh gale from the W. West
at 2 P.M. were ship to the S.W. West at 3 P.M.
Right whale in the fore and at 10 were to the
W. West employed sawing Bone Sailed
Lat 11° 35' 45" Long by Chronometer 13° 30' 45" East

Remarks On Sunday Sept 25th

Commenced with strong gale from the W. West
attended with Rain at 4 P.M. took in the fore and
main top sails heading to the W. West
Middle Part heavy gale and squalls at midnight took
in the fore sail at 6 P.M. took in the West Boat
Latter Part the gale still increasing at 8 took in the
main top sail and fore top mast stay sail Sailed
Lat 11° 35' 15" South

Remarks On Monday Sept 26th

Commenced with heavy gale from the W. West
attended with squalls of Rain at 1 P.M. rest the
main top sails Middle Part much the same
Latter Part more moderate at 8 P.M. rest the
fore top mast stay sail and were ship to the
S.W. West fresh gale from S.W. West at 4 P.M.
Lat 11° 35' 15" South Long by Chronometer 13° 30' 45" East



Remarks On Board Tuesday Sept 27th 1831

Commenced with fresh gale from the S.W. West
heading to the S.W. West
Middle Part moderate and squalling
Latter Part moderate gale and fair weather
all hands employed in ship Sailed Lat 11° 35' 45" South

Remarks On Wednesday Sept 28th

Commenced with moderate gale from the S.W. West
and pleasant weather. Turning at 4 P.M.
Middle Part light breeze attended with squalls
Latter Part fresh pleasant weather
Turning at 4 P.M. West saw number of fisher boats
Sailed Lat 11° 35' 24" S Long

Remarks On Thursday Sept 29th

Commenced with light breeze from the
S.W. West with fine pleasant weather
Turning at 4 P.M. Middle Part much the same
Latter Part light breeze from the S.W. West
with fine pleasant weather turning to
the W. West with all hands at sea
Sailed Lat 11° 35' 14" South

Remarks On Friday Sept 30th

Commenced with light breeze from the Eastward
and pleasant. Turning to the S.W. West at 2 P.M. saw
one Right whale could not partur
at 4 P.M. saw a sail to the W. West at 5 P.M. saw a sail to
the W. West and Middle Part pleasant weather
Latter Part much the same at 8 P.M. saw 40 ships
at 9 P.M. spoke the ship 11 miles of W. West 100 miles
the ship of W. West 1500 tons. Brooman
Harkins 500 Sailed Lat 11° 35' 27" South

Remarks On Saturday Oct 1st 1831

Commenced with moderate breeze from the S.W. West
turning by the wind to the S.W. West at 4 P.M. saw one
Right whale could not partur
Middle Part attended with Rain
Latter Part fair weather at 11 P.M. saw one whale
could not partur Sailed Lat 11° 35' 24" South

Remarks On Sunday Oct 2nd

Commenced with light breeze from the S.W. West
and fair weather saw number of whales could not
partur Middle Part light breeze and pleasant
Latter Part the same two sails in sight at 11 P.M.
spoke ship 11 miles of W. West 1500 tons. Brooman
Harkins 500 Sailed Lat 11° 35' 20" South the ship came on board

Remarks On Board Monday Oct 3rd 1831

Commenced with fresh breeze from the S.W. West
at 1 P.M. saw one Right whale the ship 11 miles of W. West
for the whole could not partur and killed her at 4 P.M. spoke
Middle Part calm and fine weather
Latter Part light breeze from the S.W. West with pleasant
weather 3 ships in sight to the W. West and one to the
S.W. West saw number of backs and fins Sailed Lat 11° 35' 34" South

Remarks On Tuesday Oct 4th

Commenced with light breeze from the S.W. West
and fine weather. Four ships in sight
Middle Part pleasant
Latter Part the same at 10 P.M. saw two whales
could not partur and killed one of them at 11 P.M. took the
Whale a very nice cow Commenced butting Sailed Lat 11° 35' 27" South

Remarks On Wednesday Oct 5th

Commenced with moderate breeze from the S.W. West
turning by the wind to the S.W. West employed
bailing Middle Part pleasant weather
Latter Part the same turning to the S.W. West four
ships in sight at 11 P.M. saw one whale
could not partur and killed him Sailed Lat 11° 35' 43" South Long by Chronometer 13° 30' 45" East
