

May Wednesday 25th A. D. 1831
 On board of the Ship *Harvea* of New Bedford
 the first part of these 24 hours Commences With Strong
 winds from the N. W. and clearing along Down the island
 of Pico under Double reefed maintop sail & foresail and
 the watch employed in Ships Duty &c. at 6 Pm fished the
 foresail & close reefed the maintop sail and hove to under
 the lee of the island of Pico & St. George & blowing
 & raining Strong &c. and middle part much the same &c.
 at 8 Pm the same kind of weather &c. and latter part much
 the same &c. hove to under the lee of the island & sounds
 the 24 hours

May Thursday 26th
 the first part of these 24 hours Commences With a gale
 of wind from the North and under a Close reefed main
 top sail and squally &c. at 4 Pm the same as before &c. &c.
 at 6 Pm a Sloop of War ran down past us and blow
 ing Strong from the North &c. and middle part more
 moderate &c. at 8 Pm made all sail and took
 our Departure from St. George's island down to
 St. Michaels Course by Compass S. E. by E. &c. and
 latter part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and
 the island of Teacapa bearing N. by W. and
 Satt in by Clock 38° 17' & Sound these 24 hours

Friday May 27th A. D. 1831
 the first part of these 24 hours Commences with plea
 sant weather winds from the N. S. W. and the
 watch employed in Ships Duty &c. &c. at 4 Pm
 saw the island of St. Michaels at 7 Pm got down to
 the land & shortened sail and a Strong Sail insight
 and blowing Strong &c. at 11 Pm was Ship at 1 Pm
 fished the fore & maintop sail and raining &c. at 5 Pm fished the
 foresail and thick weather and raining &c. at 10 Pm more mod
 erate and sounds these 24 hours with thick weather &c. &c.

Saturday May 28th Day A. D. 1831
 the first part of these 24 hours Commences With thick weathe
 and winds South and a Sail insight laying to at 2 Pm

Saw the Land the west End of St. Michaels 10
 miles bearing East and moderate & Satt the fore
 and maintop top sails &c. at 7 Pm Made all sail
 and light winds & a Strong Sail insight &c. and at
 11 Pm was Ship & stood in towards the land at 2 Pm
 was Ship & stood up and light winds from the S. W.
 and pleasant weather &c. at 7 Pm the watch cameled and
 calmed and at 8 Sail insight &c. at 10 Pm a Strong
 breeze and at 11 Pm Calmed and Sun rain and
 sounds these 24 hours Done Satt in this Day 37° 46'

Sunday May 29th A. D. 1831 &c.
 The first part of these 24 hours Commences With thick
 winds from the E. S. E. and close in under St. Michaels
 at 1 Pm the Mate went aboard of "Brig"
 & portiques and without provisions and we supplied them with
 Bread and Meat &c. at 4 Pm Calmed and raining and the
 Land bearing N. E. 10 miles Dist. the Ship at St.
 Michaels &c. at 6 Pm a Strong breeze from from
 the N. W. E. and Double reefed top sails &c. at 9 Pm
 fished the fore & maintop sail and a Man fell from
 a loft and hurt him considerable bad. a man by
 the name of trip belonging to New Bedford and mid
 lepart blowing heavy & raining &c. at 4 Pm close
 reefed the maintop sail &c. at 8 Pm more Ship and
 fished the foresail and blowing heavy & raining and
 sounds these 24 hours Satt in by Clock 37° 47' North

May Monday 30th A. D. 1831
 the first part of these 24 hours Commences With thick
 weather and a Gale of wind from the North and &c.
 at 4 Pm winds more moderate & thick Clouds &c.
 at 9 Pm moderate & set the foresail and middle part
 blowing Strong &c. 5 Pm more moderate and main sail
 and at 10 Pm made the Isle of St. Michaels at meridian
 the Land bore North and sounds these 24 hours
