

Tuesday May 31. A. D. 1831.

On board of the Ship Thetis of New Bedford Capt. Good. This at this present time running a long under the land and fresh breezes from the North & all sail set and the watch employed in Ships Duty &c. &c. at 4 Pm stood close in to the harbour of St. Michaels and blowing strong from the North at 5 Pm Drizzle veiled topsails and furled the mainsail &c. and middle part pleasant weather at 6 Pm stood in for the land &c. at 8 Pm the mate a shore and carried down letters and sounds these 24 hours lying off & on the harbour of St. Michaels and &c.

Wednesday June 1st. A. D. 1831.

these 24 hours commences with off & on the harbour and Capt. Thayer on board belonging to Portland. On fine pleasant weather &c. at 3 Pm put the Capt. On board of his Brig and stood off the harbour &c. at 12 at night and more clear & stood in again &c. and at 6 Pm the land bearing E. N. E. & stood in for the harbour at 11 Pm the Capt. went a shore and sounds these 24 hours. & Laying off & the Harbour of St. Michaels

Thursday June 2nd. A. D. 1831 &c.

these 24 hours commences with strong breeze from the west and the Capt. a shore &c. at 6 Pm came off and blowing strong & some rain &c. and middle part light winds at 2 Pm more ship and stood in for the land and light winds &c. at 4 Pm the boat a shore or rather on board of the Portland Brig and back and stood off at sea and sounds these 24 hours &c. &c.

Friday June 3rd. &c.

these 24 hours commences with calms in close with the land and 3 Pm a light breeze off wind from the West &c. at 6 Pm took ship and stood to the North and west &c. at 2 Pm more ship and stood to the South &c. at 5 Pm more ship and stood to the north and west &c. at 10 Pm saw the land and sounds these 24 hours close in with the harbour of St.

Michales and sounds these 24 hours &c. &c.

Saturday June 4th. A. D. 1831

the first part of these 24 hours commences with fresh breeze of wind from the W. S. W. & a boat a laying off and on the harbour &c. at 5 Pm the boat came off for the Cape de Vidy. England St. Michaels bears in. Note the course S. S. E. by Compass &c. at 7 pleasant weather and all sail set &c. &c. and middle part fresh breezes from the W. S. W. & furled the fore & main topgallant sail &c. at 5 Pm saw the land the island of St. Marys bearing W. by N 22 miles Dis. and from which I take my Departure and it being in the Lat of 36. 58 North and Long in 20. 10 West &c. and latter part of these 24 hours with light winds from the S. W. and Lat in. By Chron 36. 30 North and long in by Chron 20. 15 West &c. &c.

Sunday June the 5th. Day &c. &c.

the first part of these 24 hours commences with light winds and pleasant weather and the watch employed in Ships Duty &c. and middle part pleasant weather and winds from the W. S. W. &c. at 5 Pm much the same weather and all hands employed in the Sabbath &c. and latter part pleasant weather and winds from the W. S. W. and Lat in by Chron 35. 23. and Long in 23. 17 West

Monday June the 6th the first part of these

24 hours commences with pleasant weather and winds from the S. W. by W. at 4 Pm light winds &c. and middle part the same winds and weather &c. at 7 Pm saw a great plenty of Blackfish and forced all 3 boats but did not make out anything and came on board and light winds & pleasant weather and winds from the S. W. &c. and latter part of these 24 hours with pleasant weather and Lat in by Chron 34. 42. North and Long in 24. 59 West &c.
