the first part of these 24 hours commenced with fresh breezes from
the E. N. E. and course S. S. E. and thick weather & flying clouds
at 5. Pm Sun & Stars. Sail standing to the South and
west &c. at 9 Pm took in all sail and wore ship and
came to with our Starboard tacks on board and at Daylight
made all sail and course S. S. E. &c. at 7 Pm course sou-
th by S. winds S. E. &c. and Soards these 24 hours and
Latt in by Chk 21. 46 North & Long in 22. 15 West &c.

Thursday June the 16 Day A. D. 1831
the first part of these 24 hours commenced with strong breezes
from the E. S. E. course S. W. and in the Edge of Green
water &c. at 9 Pm blowing strong from the N. E.
and fired the fore and main topsail and double reefed
the maintopsail and hauled the foresail up &c. and
middle part strong breezes & a large second or rather
a small &c. at 5 Pm made all sail and more
morsvrit &c. and latter part fresh breeze from the
S. E. and Latt in by Chk 19. 33 North
And Long in 22. 11 West &c. &c.

Friday June the 17 Day
the first part of these 24 hours commenced with
fresh breezes from the N. E. & course S. W. by S.
and the watch employed in Ship's Duty &c. &c.
at 4 Pm more morsvrit &c. thick weather and D.
plenty of fish under the ship's hough &c. and middle
part pleasant weather &c. and latter part of these 24 hours
the same And Latt in by Chk 17. 30 North
And Long in 22. 50 West &c. &c.

Saturday June the 18 Day A. D. 1831
the first part of these 24 hours commenced with fine
breezes of wind from the E. S. E. course S. S. W. and
D. Strong Sail on sight &c. at 6 Pm spoke the ship
Lima of Bonifichat and at 8 Pm took in sail and la-
to all night to the windward of the island of
isle of Sal &c. at 5 Pm made all sail and at 6 Pm

made the Land &c. at 10 Pm went a Shore to
fishing and Soards these 24 hours & Laying off and
the Island it being in the Latt of 16. 45 North
and Long in 22. 50 West &c. &c.

Sunday June 19 Day A. D. 1831
the first part of these 24 hours commenced with
pleasant weather & laying off and the island and
the boat a Shore & fishing &c. at 2 Pm came
on board with a fine lot of fish and shaped our
course for the island of Bonavesta course
by Compass S. by W. and a point & 1/2 westerly vari-
ation and light winds from the E. S. E. &c.
and middle part the same winds and weather &c.
and latter part of these 24 hours steering for the
isle of Mayo and found ourselves 35 miles to
westward Eastward of the Island and at
12 o'clock found ourselves with a current setting
to the Eastward at the rate 30 miles in 24 hours
and Latt in this Day 15. 05 North And
Long in 22. 30 West Long in &c. &c.

Monday June the 20 Day & C.
the first part of these 24 hours commenced with
thick weather & winds from the North and D.
fine breezes &c. at 2 Pm made the Isle of Mayo
&c. and at 6 Pm spoke the ship Lima of Bonifichat
and lay off & on the island of Mayo &c. at 11
Am the boat went On Shore to trade with the
Indians and Soards these 24 hours &c. &c.

Tuesday June 21st Day A. D. 1831
the first part of these 24 hours commenced
with pleasant weather and the boat a Shore
&c. and at 4 Pm the boat came off at 5
Pm went on Shore again &c. at 7 Pm went
and stayed all night and the ship a lay-
in off and in the harbour and Soards these
24 hours and latter part the boat came on
